**General Description:**

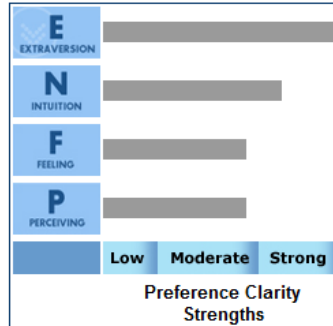
