

## Biology 230 – Human Anatomy and Physiology – Spring 2008

Description: Selected details of the structure and function of all human organ systems are presented. The course is designed to serve students majoring in human health care-related fields.

Prerequisite: Biology 100 - Human Biology or equivalent.

Objectives: Upon successful completion of the course, you should be able to:

- Describe the structure and function of the skeletal system including its joints.
- Describe the structure and function of the nervous system.
- Identify major muscles of the skull, trunk, and extremities.
- Describe the structure and function of skeletal, smooth, and cardiac muscle tissue.
- Describe the structure of the heart, the pattern of major blood vessels, and the function of the circulatory system.
- Describe the structure and function of the respiratory system.
- Describe the structure and function of the digestive system.
- Describe the structure and function of the urinary system.
- Describe the structure and function of the reproductive system.

Grading: There will be 5 exams (each worth 100 points) including the fifth exam during final-exam week. Your final grade will be the sum of points earned on the 5 exams divided by 500, the total points possible. The grading scale is:  $A \geq 90 > B \geq 80 > C \geq 70 > D \geq 60 > U$ . You can at any time figure out your grade in the course by averaging the scores on your exams. If a significant illness or emergency will cause you to miss an exam notify me before the missed exam or you may not be allowed to make up the exam. If allowed to make up a missed exam, you must make up the exam promptly.
