OBSERVATIONS ON WINTERING BALD EAGLES AT GARRISON DAM, NORTH DAKOTA. The first migrating Bald Eagles, an adult pair, were seen on 19 October 1972 two miles south of the Garrison Dam powerhouse. One eagle was observed almost daily along the tailrace waters of the powerhouse from the above date to 29 November when two adults were again seen.

At 4:15 p.m., 5 December, while patrolling the Downstream Public Use Area, Frank Splendoria, Park Manager Trainee, saw three adult and two immature Bald Eagles perched in a cottonwood along the river. These eagles were observed for 18 minutes until all had flown off. On 18 December, five eagles with the same age ratio as on 5 December, were seen in the same area. The next day only three eagles, of undetermined age, were seen. After 19 December 1972 until mid-April 1973, only one pair of adults was observed below the powerhouse.

During the previous 19 years, Johnny Martinson and Edmund Franke, next day only three eagles, of undetermined age, were seen. After 19 December Reservoir Rangers, do not recall seeing more than three wintering Bald Eagles at Garrison Dam. Frank A. Splendoria, U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, Riverdale, N.D. 58565.
