1. A. Students must schedule the foundation studies courses in the earliest possible sequence. These courses should be completed within the first 30 hours of coursework.
 - ENG 101 English Composition I
 - ENG 102 English Composition II
 - COMM 100 Fundamentals of Oral Communication
 - MATH 110 College Algebra
 - CIS 101 Introduction to Computer Information Systems
- B. The Personal Wellness class (HHP 200) is normally completed within the first two years.
2. Except for MATH 331 Calculus Methods, MATH 250 Elements of Statistics, ECFI 201 Principles of Economics: Micro, and ECFI 202 Principles of Economics: Macro, the 37 hour requirement for Liberal Arts may be scheduled as determined by the advisor and student. MATH 331 and MATH 250 are major requirements that fulfill 6 hours in the Math and Natural Sciences Distribution; ECFI 201 and ECFI 202 are major requirements that fulfill 6 hours in the Social and Behavioral Sciences Distribution.
3. Remember that students must take one science with a lab.
