    - i) HubSpot Stop Out Plan

The Graduate School is currently working on a plan for students who have "stopped out" students who started taking classes and then stopped for around 1-1/2 years. We will reach out to them and send them an email through HubSpot and hopefully have some communication with the student. The reason this is being done in HubSpot is because we can track it and get metrics with it.

There has been some success and Bonnie and Craig, the Degree Analysts, help to identify the students and then go from there. If you see students who have not taken classes for a while start to take classes again, it may be the result of this. As soon as the students do notify us that they are returning, we do loop the department in if they return.

From what Dr. Bremer could tell, most of the students there presenting had already graduated and had come back to the competition. If your departments have any students who may be interested in this, you may want to start talking to them about this soon.

Dr. Pool-Funai added that the students who were selected to come to MAGS had already won their school's competition so these institutions do their own internal competition, then they go to MAGS. There is a 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup>, and 3<sup>rd</sup> place award that she believes comes with a cash award for the students.

Dr. Kim Perez asked if the presentations have to be live?

Dr. Bremer responded that they do. However, at the institutional level the presentation could be recorded and reviewed for judging.

Dr. Angela Pool-Funai added that at MAGS, there was not a virtual option.

MAGS does send out the categories ahead of time. Dr. Pool-Funai has shared this information in the past, but has not had much interest for nominations.

Dr. Bremer added that if you see any of this information coming your way, this is what it is referencing. It will come at a weird time though.
