**Two very important items for both new and returning students.....**

**FIRST- SPEAK ENGLISH!! You won't improve if you don't practice.**

**SECOND - READ the Monthly Newsletters and Weekly Emails**

**You will receive a monthly newsletter and emails from the International Student Services Office.** Communicating in English is the best way to improve your language ability. The newsletter and emails are our way to keep in touch, but more importantly to share valuable information with you that may help you avoid making a costly mistake. **You can also submit articles or items of interest to be published in the newsletter.** If you have an item of interest such as you received an award, will be competing in a sporting event, have something you want to buy or are trying to sell, or if you belong to a student group and would like to publicize an upcoming event we would be happy to include that information. Please submit information to Marnie Kohl in the International Student Services Office. The newsletter is written and produced the third week of each month. We would love to have students be an active part of the newsletter.

**Just a reminder**.....Immigration law requires all international students to enroll AND remain in a full course load, which constitutes 12 credit hours for undergraduate and 9 hours for graduate students. Please remember, you can only take ONE (1) virtual college course during a semester to be counted toward a full course load. If you find it necessary to withdraw from a course that would put you below full time, you must check with the International Office FIRST before you drop your course. Also, remember that while school is in session, you are only allowed to work 20 hours per week on campus. We are required to monitor the number of hours students work on campus, and will be checking with on campus employers to verify this. **Please do not let work interfere with your academic course work.**

The USCIS (U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services), has a reporting system called SEVIS. This program requires all schools that issue I-20's and DS-2019's, to report all international students enrolled at their school, the number of credit hours, current address, phone number and if the student is in status with immigration. For this reason **it is very important for you to remain in status and always have your current address and phone number (if you have one) on file with the International Student Services Office.**

Please get involved on campus. If you like sports, the Intramural Department has lots of activities you can become involved in. You can also attend all FHSU college sporting events for FREE with your Tiger Card. If you like music and theatre, The Encore Series has a great performing arts calendar, which is very affordable. The cost for students is very low, compared to what you would pay to see a Broadway Show in a major city. There are also music programs and theatre productions by FHSU students and faculty held on campus. We will inform you of these events in our correspondence with you. **Again, my message to you is get involved, meet new people, practice your English, experience American culture and have fun!!** These activities are a great way to take a break from your studies and relief some stress!

## TB Screening

**All international students are required to have a TB screening on file in the Students Health Office. IF YOU HAVE NOT HAD THE TB SCREENING DONE, A HOLD WILL BE PLACED ON YOUR ENROLLMENT, AND YOU WILL NOT BE ALLOWED TO ATTEND CLASSES**

If you have already had a TB screening done somewhere else in the United States, you will need to have the results sent to the Student Health Office for your file or you will have to have another one done. The Student Health Office will provide this screening and you will need to make an appointment with that office. There may be a fee you will have to pay. If you have any questions regarding this, please stop by the Student Health Center which is located in the lower level of the Memorial Union.

## FHSU POLICE DEPARTMENT WELCOMES YOU TO CAMPUS

The University Police are here to **protect, serve, and lend assistance** during your stay. In addition to performing expected police functions, our team of Police Officers will provide vehicle unlock service, jump-starts, small amounts of fuel, and on campus escorts on request. ## PERSONAL INFORMATION UPDATES

With the SEVIS regulations that are in place, the International Student Services Office is required to have current information on **all students on an F-1 or J-1 visa**. This includes address, phone number and e-mail address. If you have not provided Marnie with your current contact information, please see her in Sheridan Hall 208 within ten days of moving. This is required by SEVIS and we must have current information on all F-1 or J-1 visa holders at all times. You may still change your information on the TigerTracks through the internet, **BUT YOU MUST ALSO NOTIFY THE OFFICE OF INTERNATIONAL STUDENT SERVICES**.

## TIGERTRACKS & FHSU UNIVERSITY EMAIL

TigerTracks is Fort Hays State University's Web portal. TigerTracks provides centralized single sign-on access to student university e-mail, the Blackboard course delivery system, announcements, and other FHSU Online Services through your own customizable homepage! The **Online Services** section of **TigerTracks** provides access to the TigerEnroll system, class schedules, advisor contact information, financial aid status, grades, personal contact and emergency notification information, and more! The International Student Services Office uses the university email to communicate with international students. **Please make sure you are checking your university email account everyday!**

## SPEAKERS BUREAU—SCHOOL LECTURING PROGRAM

## ISU MEMBERSHIP

All students, new and returning, are invited to sign-up for International Student Union (ISU)! ISU hosts events and activities and provides the main basis for international students to meet other international students as well as American students. As a paid member of ISU, you will have benefits that not all international students will have like first priority to go on field trips. We encourage you to be a member of ISU and get involved in these activities. It will help you get adjusted to an environment different from your own country more quickly. The cost for one semester is \$4 and the academic year is \$6. Returning students must pay and sign up with Marnie each year. Stop by Sheridan Hall 208 and see Marnie if you would like to sign up.

## DRINKING AGE IN THE UNITED STATES IS 21

The legal drinking age in the United States is 21. If you are not 21 and you drink, you risk being fined at least \$200 or as much as \$500. If anyone asks you to purchase alcohol for them, be extremely careful. If you purchase alcohol for a person under the age of 21, you can receive the same fine as the person drinking under age. Even worse, if that person commits a crime or is harmed while they are intoxicated by the alcohol you purchased for them, then you could face jail time or deportation. Please think carefully if you are faced with these situations.

## AMERICAN ACCENT PROGRAM

If you or someone you know would like to **speak English with the phrasing and intonation of the General American dialect**, the Herndon Clinic and the Department of Communication Disorders has the program for you! The program is for those who have good basic skills in English grammar and vocabulary and would like to improve their speaking skills. It is two credit hours SLP 318 and one credit hour lab SLP 318L. ## SO, NOW I'M IN HAYS. . HOW DO I GET WHERE I NEED TO GO?

This question is tricky for seasoned FHSU veterans as well as first time students. How do I get to Wal-Mart? How can I get to Wichita or Denver? We hear these questions quite often in our office and frankly there is no easy answer. We have broken transportation into categories to help you keep it all straight.

### PLANES

If you want to get out of town quickly, this is your best option. The Hays Airport offers daily flights to Denver. This means from Hays you can connect to all airports both far and wide. Flying Hays is your best option if you do not have a car or driver's license to drive to any of the other large airports that are all located 300+ miles away. It is also much easier to ask one of your friends to drop you off and pick you up at the Hays Airport than it is to ask him or her to drive you to another state so you can fly out.

### TRAINS

No way, not in Hays!

### AUTOMOBILES

Cars – The most popular choice of transportation in Hays (as if you couldn't already tell). One option many students explore is obtaining their own driver's license and car. To become legal to drive in Kansas, you must successfully pass both a written and driving test. Once you have your license, you may want to purchase a vehicle. Before making this purchase think about the price of the vehicle, the cost of tags and taxes (which is yearly), insurance, gas, and maintenance expenses (oil changes, new tires, etc.) If you are planning on parking on-campus, you are required to buy a parking permit. Also, take into consideration how long you will be in Hays and what you will do with your vehicle when you leave Hays or the United States.

Tiger Transport – Tiger Transport is a FREE van transportation service that runs a fixed route throughout Hays. It operates each Wednesday and Friday from 2:00-7:00pm and Saturday from 2:00-9:00pm. Tiger Transport stops at downtown Hays, The Mall, Hastings, and Wal-Mart. The van pick up location on campus is at the north end of Wiest Hall parking lot. Safe Ride—Don't take the risk of driving drunk or riding with someone else who has been drinking. Safe Ride offers a free ride home, no questions asked. This service runs Wednesday through Saturday 10pm to 3am. Call (785) 621-2580

Access Van – Access Van operates seven days a week and will take students anywhere in the City of Hays. They do not operate 24 hours a day. You must call 628-1052 to schedule a pick up time. A ride costs \$1.50 each way. Visit the Access Van website for their daily schedule and view all rules associated with riding the van.

Friends – Most students attending FHSU have vehicles, as well as some international students. Asking others with vehicles (and licenses) to drive you somewhere is appropriate. It's also considered good taste to reimburse your driver with gas money. This may also entice your friend to keep hauling you around.

## OTHER WAYS TO GET WHERE YOU NEED TO GO

Bicycle – Riding a bicycle is a great way to get around campus. If you decide to ride, make sure you know the rules of the road. Drivers in Hays are not accustomed to seeing lots of cyclists, so ride defensively and pay attention to cars. You will also want to purchase a lock and keep your bicycle locked up at all times!

Walking – Walking does not cost anything and you actually get some exercise too, which is a good thing! Remember when walking on campus to walk on the sidewalk and to cross the street only at the marked cross walk because drivers may not stop if you're not in the cross walk. Also, never walk alone at night, always take a buddy! If you have additional questions about transportation, please stop by and see Karen in Sheridan Hall 208.
