IMMIGRATION INFORMATION – OPTIONAL PRACTICAL TRAINING

Are you graduating this May 2011 semester or during the summer? If you are and want to apply for optional practical training please stop by the International Student Office **as soon as possible** and pick up the paperwork. Please have your application completed and turned into the International Office by Monday, May 9. Practical training applications can take 60–90 days to be processed and returned from UCIS. **REMEMBER, you cannot start a job until you receive this work authorization.** Also, you are required to keep the International Office informed of your current job status, whether you do or do not have a job. This must be reported in the SEVIS system until the end of your OPT.

ADDRESS UPDATES

All International Students are required to inform the International Student Office (Sheridan Hall Room 208) of any address or phone number changes. It is very important that we have your current information at all times. If you know your summer address and phone number please stop by the office.

Are you graduating this May 2011 semester? If you are and want to apply for Optional Practical Training (OPT) please stop by the International Student Office **as soon as possible** and pick up the paperwork. With the SEVIS requirements you **SHOULD PLAN TO APPLY** for Practical Training **BEFORE** you complete your degree. Practical training applications can take 60-90 days to be processed and returned from BCIS in Lincoln, NE (formerly INS). **Remember, you cannot start a job until you receive this work authorization.**

GROUP HEALTH INSURANCE

The International Student Services Office requires all international student to have group health insurance. If you have your own insurance we want to make sure that students are aware of the procedure. The forms that students are required to complete if they have their own health insurance have been updated for the upcoming academic year and are ready to pick up. The required forms are the Acceptance/Denial Form and the waiver form. The forms have important information as well as deadlines on when forms and proof of insurance must be turned in. Please make sure to review your policy and renew the insurance before it expires.

Health insurance is required for all Fort Hays State University international students. If you are not purchasing the Kansas Board of Regents insurance plan, you must turn in the Student Health Insurance Waiver Form with a copy of your policy's benefits summary page (in English), and the Acceptance/Denial Form **EVERY SEMESTER**. For the fall semester, the date is September 6 and for the spring semester it is January 30. If you have questions regarding health insurance, please visit with Marnie in the International Office. INFORMATION ON STRESS

Do you often feel stress in daily life? Are you overwhelmed when you think of what you need to do? College students often feel stress on a variety of things. Here are some symptoms and signs that appear on you when you feel over-stressed.

Physical symptoms

- Stomach ache, headache, dizziness, eye strain
- Sleep problem (too little or too much)
- Problems concentrating

Feelings

- Moodiness (feeling low or depressed)
- Anxiety (tense, nervous, jumpy, unable to relax)
- Irritable or hostile (getting angry over minor things)
- Fearfulness (afraid to make decisions)

Behaviors

- Exaggerating normal behavior (hard workers turn into workaholics)
- Withdrawing (from friends, family, and co-workers)
- Working harder (but getting less done)
- Blaming others (finding fault, being critical or hard to please)
- Having fights (about everything and nothing)
- Sharing fewer satisfactions with family and friends
- Having other family members with stress problem (stress is contagious)
- Pretending that nothing is wrong (denial)

Thoughts

- This is horrible/ unbearable. I'm not good enough.
- I'm going to go crazy.

It is important to recognize these symptoms and signs of stress overload.

If you feel stressed out, the Kelly Center can help you to find a way to cope with. They have plenty of useful information that can help you have better life.
