ON-CAMPUS EMPLOYMENT

Please remember as an F-1 or J-1 visa holder you are only allowed to work 20 hours total per week for all jobs when school is in session, and this work must be **ON CAMPUS**. Off campus employment is not allowed unless approved as part of OPT or CPT. Graduate assistantships are considered a job and counted toward the 20 hours per week. We will be verifying with the student employment office and Chartwells the number of hours students are working. If students are working more than 20 hours for all jobs, if they have more than one, we will contact them and the supervisor(s) they are working for. If you have questions regarding this, please stop by the International Office. We want you to be successful academically and don't want to work interfere with your coursework.

BICYCLES

We know students are interested in getting bicycles. Hays does not have a bicycle shop that rents bikes, they only sell them. New bikes can be purchased at Wal-Mart. If you are interested in purchasing a used bike we would suggest posting an ad in the resident halls or in the Memorial Union. The ISS office can post a request on the buy/sell/trade listing for used bikes. If used bikes are located for sale, Marnie can post the contact information and price in the weekly e-mail announcements.

Just a reminder: If you currently have a bike, please keep it locked up in one of the bike racks. Also, when you are riding it on the streets, please be careful!! Unlike the large cities some of you may come from, Hays drivers are not accustomed to a large number of bicycle riders. You must be especially careful during busy times of the days and on the major streets. The same driving rules that apply to cars apply to bicycles in the United States. Please be careful!!

TB TEST

All international students are required to have a TB test on file in the Student Health Office.

IF YOU HAVE NOT HAD THE TB TEST DONE, A HOLD WILL BE PLACED ON YOUR ENROLLMENT, AND YOU WILL NOT BE ALLOWED TO ENROLL IN CLASSES FOR THE SPRING SEMESTER!!! If you have already had a TB test done somewhere else, you will need to have the results sent to the Students Health Office for your file or you will have to have another one done. If you have any questions regarding this, please stop by the International Student Services Office and see Marnie, Karen, or Carol.

GROUP HEALTH INSURANCE PROCEDURE

The International Student Services Office has a procedure students must follow if you have your own private insurance. We want to make sure that students are aware of the procedure.

First, there is an Acceptance/Denial Form and a Student Health Insurance Waiver Form that students must complete if they have their own private health insurance. These forms have important information as well as deadlines on when forms must be turned in. Forms can be picked up in the office or you may print them from the following website <http://www.fhsu.edu/international/health/>.

Second, students must provide proof of private insurance which includes the card or certificate, explanation of benefits, and US contact information (telephone & address) all in English. The insurance must meet the minimum requirements that are listed on the Student Health Insurance Waiver Form.

Health insurance is required for all Fort Hays State University international students. If you are not purchasing the Kansas Board of Regents insurance plan, you must turn in the Student Health Insurance Waiver Form with a copy of your policy's benefits summary page (in English), and the Acceptance/Denial Form **EVERY SEMESTER**. For the spring semester, the date is, January 19, 2011. Forms & insurance brought in after this date WILL NOT be accepted. If you have questions regarding health insurance, please visit with Marnie in the International Office.

RENTING A CAR

The United States is a huge country with many cities, sites, and other tourist attractions worthwhile visiting. The question is: How can you travel to see those places? The answer might be renting a car. Car rental is definitely the best choice if you are thinking of a short or medium distance trip. It is relatively easy to do and economically convenient, especially if you are going on a trip with 3-4 people that can share the expenses.

There are three different car rental agencies in Hays: Enterprise and Hertz. In order to rent a car you need to have a valid driver's license. Hertz only accept an American driver's license, but Enterprise will accept a driver's license from whatever country you are from, as long as they can read it. Theoretically, you have to be over 25 years of age to rent a car, but Enterprise will allow you to rent a car if you 21 years old, but they will charge you a fee of \$10.00 per day, during the week and weekends for the smaller or mid-size cars. You can also choose larger and more luxurious vehicles to rent, but of course the price goes higher. During the weekdays the cost of rental per day tends to be 2-3 times more than the weekends. Obviously gas is also an expense you have to take into account when you are traveling. A major credit card is needed in order to rent a vehicle. You can rent a car on the web pages of the companies or give them a call. I would recommend to rent it through the phone, in case you have any questions.

Renting a car is a pretty convenient way to travel to and around the nearby states. You have big and fun cities like Kansas City, Denver, and Wichita you can go to, and above all with a car you have the freedom to go to whichever places you want to whenever you want to. Please remember you must have a valid drivers license as well as anyone else who drive the rental car.

IMMIGRATION INFORMATION: OPTIONAL PRACTICAL TRAINING (OPT)

Are you graduating at the end of the Fall 2010 semester? If you are, and you plan to apply for Optional Practical Training, please plan to attend the OPT Workshop that will be held on Thursday, October 28 from 3:00-4:30pm in the Trails Room of the Memorial Union. This workshop will provide you with information on what OPT is, applying for OPT, and the necessary forms.

PERSONAL COMPUTER INFORMATION

When purchasing a computer here in the U.S. or using a laptop or PC that you have brought from your home country, please be sure that it will “connect” with our on campus internet system correctly. You should also be sure that you have a **“virus protection program”** installed on your computer. This virus check will ensure that you do not pick up corrupted files or e-mail messages from outside sources that can totally take your personal system down, as well as affect the university computer network.

The CTC Helpdesk (Tomanek Hall Room 113 —628-5276) can assist you with making sure the proper connections are in place, and securing a virus protection program.

You should also **avoid downloading large files, such as music, video, and other media off the internet.** These applications take up large amounts of space on your system and the university system. You may also find that **downloading these files is “illegal”** and may result in your access to the internet being interrupted. If you have any questions regarding computer applications or purchasing a computer, please check with the CTC Helpdesk. They will be able to help you, or direct you to a professional staff member who is knowledgeable about technology.

PERSONAL INFORMATION UPDATES

With the SEVIS regulations that are in place, the International Student Services Office is required to have all students, on an F-1 or J-1 visa, current information. This includes address, phone number, and e-mail address. If you have not filled out a personal information sheet, you **MUST** notify the Office of International Student Services within ten (10) days. This is required by SEVIS and we must have current information on all F-1 or J-1 visa holders at all time. You may still change your information on the TigerTracks through the internet. **BUT YOU MUST ALSO NOTIFY THE OFFICE OF INTERNATIONAL STUDENT SERVICES.**

GETTING KANSAS DRIVER'S LICENSE

Many of you are thinking to get a driver's license in the United State. In order to get a driver's license, you need to bring some documents to Driver's License Department. The Department is located on 1222 Canterbury Dr. and the phone number is 785-625-6917.

Here are some documents that you will need to bring:

-Two Forms of ID: Valid Passport and TigerCard

-I-20 or DS2019

-I-94 card (It is usually attached to a passport)

-One Form for Proof Residency: Transcript with your current address, Valid insurance card (in English), or Bank statement with your current address.

You can get your transcript at the Registrar's Office (Sheridan Hall 108). Forms to request a transcript to obtain your drivers license must be picked up in the International Office. **You do not need to have a Social Security Number to get a driver's license.**

You will need to pass written exam first in order to practice for driving. Driving handbook is available at the Driver's License Department or you can also download it from the website,

Due to a new federal law, the international students can get only one-year driver's license; it will be expired after a year. If you wish to renew it, you can do it at the Driver's License Department.

NOTE: DO NOT PUT FHSU, FORT HAYS STATE UNIVERSITY, OR 600 PARK STREET IN ANY PART OF YOUR ADDRESS. THIS IS THE SCHOOLS ADDRESS, NOT YOURS!

This is how to write your address if you live in Stadium Place and Wooster Place:

HOW TO WRITE YOUR BIRTHDAY

In the United States, we write the date in the following order:

Month/Day/Year

Example: 06/29/1983 (June 29, 1983)

Please check your passport, I-20, DS-2019, and I-94 card to verify if your birthday is correctly written.

EMERGENCY TELEPHONE NUMBER

The International Student Services Office has a cell phone that can be called after normal office hours or on the weekend for emergency purposes. We would ask that if you have questions that can be answered during normal office hours that you call the office number at 628-4276. If an emergency situation such as sickness, problem or an accident happens outside of office hours, please use the cell phone number 785-259-0005 and someone from the ISS will try to assist you.

HAYS MEDICAL CENTER BILLS AND HEALTH INSURANCE

First, if you purchased the group health insurance through FHSU (not a private health insurance in the US or your home country), your insurance cards are in the International Office in Sheridan Hall 208 for you to pick up. We will need to make a copy of your card for your file. Second, for those students who had to get a chest x-ray and are receiving bills from Hays Medical Center and Radiology Associates, once you receive your health insurance card bring that in and your bills and Marnie will help you with the next step in getting this paid. Please do not hesitate to come in and see Marnie if you have questions with any medical insurance needs.

CONVERSATION GROUP

Do you want to improve your English skills? Do you want to meet other students? Here is a good opportunity to do both of them!
