Introduction

The 2006 – 2007 academic year continued to be a year of renovation and change for the Memorial Union. An \$8.5 million renovation project officially began in November, 2005 and continued throughout this academic year. Completion is scheduled for August, 2007. Services, meetings, dinners and special events continued to occur throughout the year with some disruption and inconvenience, as the building remained open during the renovation project. Certain services and facilities were curtailed or closed during the year due to renovation.

A new concept for the student organization office area opened this past year. Called the Center for Student Involvement (CSI), this area brought together the offices of the Student Government Association, the University Activities Board, and support space for other student organizations and Greek Life. Full-time staff assisted students in the development of meaningful learning outcomes through their participation in student activities. Occupying new offices in the CSI were staff in the newly created positions of Assistant Director of Student Activities, Diversity Coordinator and part-time Administrative Assistant.

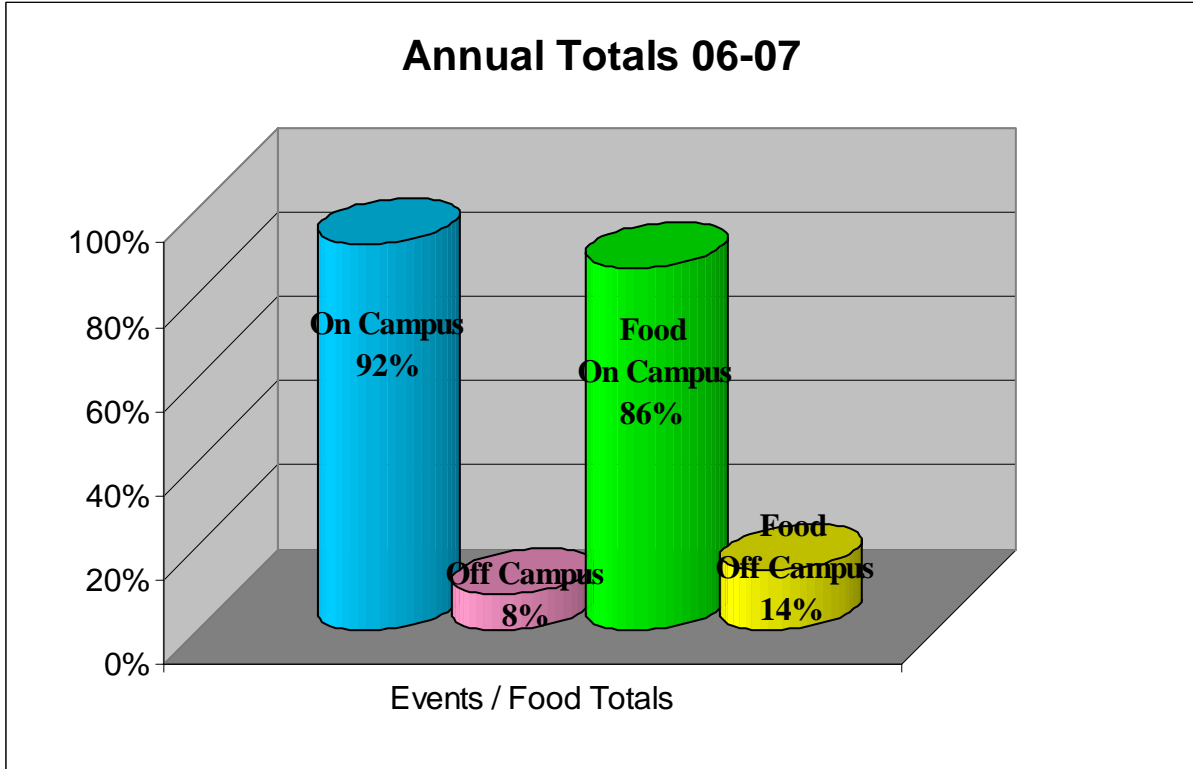
Facilities

The renovation of the Memorial Union began in November, 2005. The contractor awarded the bid for the renovation was Paul-Wertenberger Construction of Hays, Kansas. During this academic year, meeting room and event activity was curtailed due to renovation. Also, the Union Station food court area was closed on May 15th, and remained closed until February, 2007.

The parties involved in the renovation process met monthly to discuss progress and resolve issues. A separate committee met regularly to discuss and decide on furnishings to be purchased such as tables, chairs, office furniture, lounge furniture, equipment, etc. A Union renovation web site maintains a photo gallery of progress as well as informational construction updates. < <http://www.fhsu.edu/union/renovation/> >

Meeting Room Reservations

During 2006 – 2007, there were a total of 892 reservations for the use of Memorial Union reservable spaces. This represents a 53% decrease from the previous year. A decrease was anticipated, as many of the reservable spaces in the Union were not available due to renovation. Pre-renovation reservations were totaled 2,078, and this year's renovations totaled 892.

Mission Statement

2. Developed a campus-wide collaboration called the Multicultural Student Coalition that welcomes people from all backgrounds to include their knowledge and values into the establishment of a 12 Month Diversity Calendar.
3. Provided diversity training to faculty, students, and staff which helped to foster and value the open and free exchange of ideas.
4. Provided funding and resources to assist the efforts of several clubs, organizations, and academic departments to support the Diversity Plan.
5. Established a Diversity Ambassador Program to encourage students to become involved in the University's Diversity Plan.

6. Incorporated the dimensions of diversity into the University's website as a direct link from the home page.

Office of Greek Life

Special Events

2006-2007 was the 25th Anniversary Celebration of the Encore Series. As such, we received extra funds from Dr. Hammond to present an exceptional season. The Encore Series is

comprised of 8 events annually which are selected by a committee of FHSU students, faculty and staff. Additionally, in 2007 the Director of Special Events applied for a bonus performance by the National Symphony Orchestra from the Kennedy Center in Washington D.C., and Hays was selected as one of four primary sites for the NSO Kansas Residency. Fort Hays State, Hays and surrounding communities responded enthusiastically and 922 season tickets were sold; and increase of nearly 100 over the previous year.
