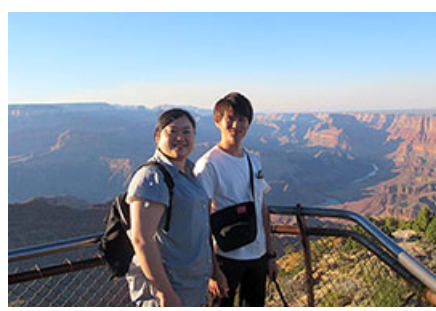


Visit to Fort Hays State campus a thrill for Colorado third-graders
