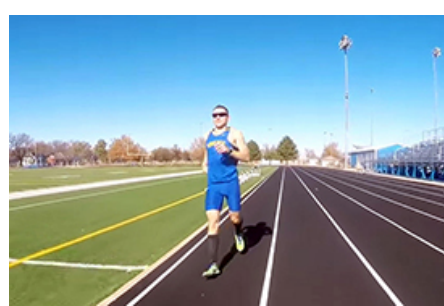


### Forsyth Library's Scholars Repository goes live with academic, creative work from FHSU

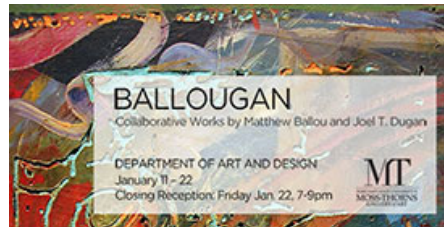
### FHSU's Cory Keehn qualifies for USA Olympic Trials in the half-marathon

Fort Hays State's Cory Keehn qualified for the USA Olympic Team Trials in the half-marathon on Sunday in the Chevron Houston Marathon. He finished with a time of 1:04:26.

Keehn hit the 1:05:00 standard to qualify for the USA Olympic Team Trials in the half marathon in February. He finished 29th in the race and 19th among competitors from the United States. Keehn kept an impressive 4-minute, 55-second pace per mile over the 13.1-mile race. [More](#)

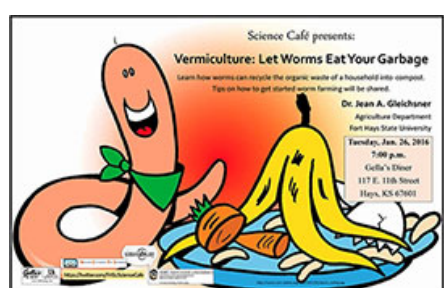
### Closing reception for Ballougan exhibit Friday, Jan. 22
