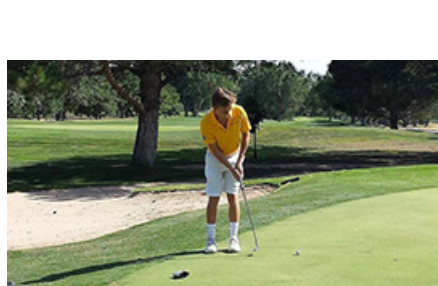


FHSU faculty member publishes essay, co-edits book
