Residential Life will be contacting camp coordinators in October to determine which camps will be returning and what dates they will be on campus.

Pending Renovations:

McMindes Hall—The west side windows will be replaced in the summer 2013. There will be renovations made to the floor lobbies (2-6) and painting of the hall ways. Approximately half of the building will be taken off line for these renovations leaving 300 beds available for 2012 summer camps and conferences.

Agnew Hall and Stadium Place – There are no renovations scheduled at this time. Agnew will be utilized for adult groups and Stadium Place will continue to be an option for the FHSU English Master's Program.

Custer Hall – If KAMS expands some remodeling on the second floor is possible. If remodeling does not happen, there are approximately 100 beds available for 2013 summer camps and conferences. There will be painting of some of the rooms and a possible remodeling of the front desk area.

Wiest Hall—Approximately 420 beds are available for 2013 summer camps and conferences.

Changes to Summer 2012:

After attending the ACUHO-I Business Operations Conference in the fall of 2011 several changes were made to the summer camp program.

Marketing

At the start of this conference season there was an increase in marketing and a greater emphasis on growing the conference program at Fort Hays State University. The Residential Life graphic designer worked to create a brochure to highlight the program. It included pictures of the halls,

amenities, and contact information. This brochure was e-mailed to all of the Fort Hays State University faculty and staff as well as to all middle school and high school principals within a 100 mile radius of Hays, KS. It was also sent to the Girl Scout and Boy Scout regional offices of Hays, Garden City, Hutchinson, Salina, and Wichita.

Contract

After reviewing several camp contracts from other institutions significant changes were made to the Fort Hays State University Residential Life Summer Camp Contract. Some of the changes include the creation of a guarantee policy encouraging camps to provide a more accurate number of participants, outlining all of the Residential Life policies, and requiring entities outside of Fort Hays State University to provide their own insurance. This process extended the length of the contract significantly, but it provides a more accurate representation of the conference program. This contract has been reviewed by Todd Powell, Judy Getty, Anna Debes, Shana Meyer, and Dr. Tisa Mason.

Services

One of the new services provided this year was linen rentals. The goal of this is to provide a more attractive option for adult groups and generate more revenue. Another new service that was provided is camp counselor and camp participant meetings. At the start of each camp two separate meetings occurred, one with the camp counselors and one with camp participants. The goal of these meetings is to review policies, expectations, and provide a personal contact. The intention is that these meetings will help decrease damages in the residence halls and provide a more positive experience for the groups.

2013 Recommendations:

- In 2011 Residential Life provided free housing for counselors/sponsors at a 1:15 ratio. The same ratio is recommended for 2013. This policy does not apply to rooms in Stadium Place.
- No rate increase for rooms.

Energy Notes:

- The electricity cost is much lower in Custer Hall over Wiest or McMindes Halls. Every opportunity needs to be made to house camps with less than 100 people in Custer Hall to save additional money. This will pose some challenges if Residential Life keeps the short term stay option for students.
- Residential Life spent a significantly larger amount (\$20,77.59) on energy costs than in previous years. During the summer of 2011 the total KWH for June, July, and August totaled 709,024 and the residence halls were used 52 nights for camps. During the summer of 2012 the total KWH for June, July, and August totaled 1,160,548 and the residence halls were used 120 nights for camps and short term stay. In the summer of 2011 McMindes air conditioning was offline for the entire months of June and July which caused a reduction that summer.
- The estimated cost for KWH for 2011 was .062 and the estimated KWH for 2012 was .08. An increase of .018.
