14	This survey might help FHSU in designing a better home away from home for students, which is a great thing.
23	If housing is changed it needs to be made available for athletes. Having scholarships for housing count for living expenses is vital! This is because most scholarship dollars that are handed out come in the form of on-campus housing. Much more interest and demand to live in these places would be from athletes.
25	I think you should have sinks in every room for cleaning dishes, brushing teeth, and just for making it more personal.

54	As far as the convincing an upper level student to move back on campus, rent would have to be significantly cheaper than \$5,000. The average rent right now is around \$350-\$400 including bills for housing right next to campus. I live closer to my classes right now than the dorms are, and pay \$300 all bills included. Also, many upper level students have jobs that require them to stay here over the summer. Without a 12-month option, it would not be possible to move on campus and maintain a job.

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89	I am an RA in McMIndes and I would love it if RAs got a bigger room. Maybe two rooms put together.
90	If the price for housing was a little more affordable, it might attract more students. All-inclusive rent costs are difficult for some students to afford, but if a base payment was less and all other luxuries were available at additional cost, it might allow more students to afford the housing.
93	The rooms and bathrooms need to be cleaner and more spacious.
94	Rules and regulations are not enforced as it is. Walls are definitely too thin, everything can be heard next to and above the rooms. Leaky water pipes, windows do not keep the wind out...living in Wiest Hall has made me decide to leave FHSU and move back home after the semester.
95	I like the atmosphere that the dorms provide; I feel more connected to campus and having a group of people I can go to if needed. I do not like the fact that the rooms are 'cold,' we have concrete walls and tile floors. It almost feels like a prison with my belongings. If the rooms could have more touches of home I would consider living on campus again, but the cost and the food are big discouragements. I do not like paying almost \$7,000 to live in these conditions and eat the food.
96	As a graduate student, I am not really interested at all in living on campus. I am older than even most of the other graduate students, and do not want to live with people in their late teens and early 20s who have no life experiences. Also, I have a pet. If there was housing available for graduate students only it would be very beneficial, as we are on very limited budgets and could probably thrive in group housing. But I think this survey underestimates the need of females for more bathroom space.
97	The dorms definitely need an update and I think the options you are considering are terrific.

Tearing down Agnew will take out 150 spaces to live with only roughly 100 to be available if Piccen gets done. Now, let's be smart you are trying to bring people to campus, (even if there is nothing special besides being the drinking town of the middle of the US) you will run out of room for people. You can try to increase cost of living to turn people away from living in dorms but then what is the purpose.
157	I think the main problem (as an international student) is the cost of the housing. More than \$500 a month and a mandatory meal plan with few ways to cook are very expensive. As a matter of fact, I have seen very close to the campus a 2-bedroom apartments, fully furnished (washer, dryer, coach, queen size bed, kitchen) for \$600 (so \$300 by person) all bills included (gas, electricity, water, trash) except internet. Much more comfortable than a double room in a hall that cost like \$1,000 for students...

162	The dorm living in McMIndes is very acceptable but the sound proof walls would help out so much at night. 163	Living in Stadium Place Apartments kind of spoils a person!! I am very lucky to have one of these apartments, and I love them! 189	I believe new housing for incoming students is a fantastic idea. Many students currently are dissatisfied with their current living situation. Due to problems with very small rooms, broken or very old heating/AC units, and also bad community showers for a large amount of money due monthly. Also, the kitchens in common areas are disgusting because nobody cleans them up, if you're going to do that, there should be one on every single floor so that the one (like we have in Wiest) won't be so overused and abused and gross. I also think having exercise equipment in the building would be a really big bonus. I was also alarmed when I discovered that I could not move my desk, if I had a roommate this would be an issue: it is better for everyone to have their own desk. Last year my friends had issues with this in McMIndes, also...layouts like those in Wiest/McMindes makes one person's room into a walkway, not a place to live.
222	To be honest, when I was a freshman living in McMIndes/Wiest I think that is the best option! Often times no one even looks up to see who is coming in. There are no safety procedures in place to check IDs. I know this is a concern from my mom. With I-70 so close by, anybody or any criminal (like the one fugitive out on the loose) could walk, take the elevator up, and have free access on the floors. Overall I like living in the dorm and I like the meal plan.
245	After living on campus for 2 years, I have a fundamental idea of how things work. The meal services are very inadequate and WAY too expensive for the type of budget most students are on. 253	Wooster Place rent is too high. The walls are not soundproof. Neighbors smoke on premises despite 30-foot policy. New apartments should have a zero-tolerance policy for smoking. Should also have adequate parking with slanted parking spots for larger vehicles. Walls need to be thicker.
260	I used to live in Stadium Place and I did like living there because of the closeness to campus as well as the furnished apartment. I was paying plenty for Stadium Place (\$415) and that was a pretty high amount. Rent was increasing for the next year and there was no way that I could afford that. I think that students do not want to live on campus past their freshman year just because of the cost and the fact that you have to have a meal plan.
