Feasibility of Expanded Academic Advising and Career Exploration Center

As an initiative of Student Affairs, this is a request to investigate the feasibility of a university wide Academic and Career Advising Center that would serve all first-year students, freshmen (and sophomore), exploratory students and probation/suspended students. A study group has been formed:

HOMEWORK FOR STUDY GROUP:

The Study group will reach out to SGA for support and participation with feedback collection from undergraduate students.

- 3. Student Preparation for Major/Minor/Pre-Professional Areas.
- 4. Higher Retention and Persistence
- 5. Intentional Focus for students.
- 6. Student-focused, learner-centered, and collaborative relationships.
- 7. Facilitate Learning.
- 8. Faculty Work Load.
- 9. Structure for Growth.

The first meeting for the study group was held on Tuesday, February 17; two more meetings are scheduled for Friday, February 27 and Monday, March 23.
