The questions philosophers address includes the "big" ones that reflective minds in very age have wrestled with, such as "Does life have meaning?" "Is there a God?" "What is the mind?" "Is there an absolute standard of right and wrong?" and "What form of government is best?

Thus, Philosophy is not only interesting but also of immense practical value, for it equips one to think more clearly and more rationally about the important issues in one's life.
