ADMISSION OVERVIEW

ACADEMY OF MATHEMATICS & SCIENCE (AMS) AT FORT HAYS STATE UNIVERSITY

It is understood and assumed that applicants are currently enrolled in school in a grade equivalent to the U.S. tenth grade. Students enrolling at the Academy are expected to complete our two-year program, leading to a high school diploma issued by Thomas More Prep-Marian High School and completion documents from AMS. Students also have the opportunity to complete an Associate's degree from Fort Hays State University.

Academic Preparedness & Minimum Requirements to Apply:

- Completion of 10th grade of high school (required)
- Completion of high school-level Algebra II and Geometry (required)
- Completion of an official English test score is required for all international students applying to Fort Hays State University and Academy of Mathematics and Science. Candidates must have **ONE** of the following minimum English test scores for admission to FHSU:
 - TOEFL iBT score of 4
 - IELTS (International English Language Testing System) score of 6.0
 - iTEP score of 3.8
 - Duolingo score of 95
 - *International students enrolled in an accredited US high school are eligible to waive the language requirement if they have a 2.5 GPA and have taken academically required courses, including two years of English.*
- Complete pre-calculus and/or other science and math courses (recommended, not required)

- Grade point average
- Grades in core level classes
- Class rank
- ACT or SAT score
- Math proficiency exam
- Official English Language Proficiency Requirement score

Application Check List

Financial Requirements for Undergraduate International Students

Fort Hays State University welcomes applications for admission from qualified international students.

****Application Fee to apply to Fort Hays State University is \$50 non-refundable****

International students must certify the necessary funds are available to cover all necessary living and educational expenses for the entire period of proposed study. Projected educational costs for the 2026-2027 calendar year are \$30,239 based on 12 credit hours per semester. Additional credits will increase this cost. A breakdown of costs is listed below.
