In this course, students will gain knowledge and skills in digital illustration. Students will learn using the Procreate App on the iPad. Assignments and projects in the course will strengthen student design skills by cultivating:

1.Experimenting across a wide range of digital tools inspired by traditional media and manual processes

2. Exploring of various visual strategies and illustration styles

3. Clearly communicating ideas and information visually using composition, colors, and texture



4. Deepening illustration knowledge, including idea development, professional presentation, and delivery of the work

- Create digital images using various tools and methods (iPad, Procreate application)
- Understand color theory and its application in digital media
- Research visual source materials to fit the theme of an illustration

- Idea development
- Develop an awareness of the historical and contemporary contexts in digital illustration

  - An at-home assignment will be given to students for the weekend.

This will include how those understandings are applied for each assignment, as well as their technical and conceptual development. # 9. COURSE POLICIES

- 6. All deadlines for each project are final. Any late submissions will result in one letter project grade down for each class period. Absences cannot be an excuse for missing a deadline.
- 7. Students are expected to clean up the table and station at which they worked.
- 8. Students will acknowledge that images of student and their artwork can be used for PR purposes in the FHSU Painting Department's social media. Anyone who does not want such exposure, should let the instructor know at the beginning of the semester.
