I am Janett Naylor-Tincknell, President of FHSU chapter of the American Association of University Professors. I have been president for 5 years now and have witnessed the ebb and flow of shared governance, membership involvement, and faculty engagement. When reflecting on my years as FHSU-AAUP president, I see benefits, we as faculty, have reaped but I also see missed opportunities.

Because of our strong MOA contract, we have weathered outside attacks on tenure, faculty positions, academic freedom, collective bargaining, and degree programs. Compared to faculty across the state and country, we have more access to shared governance processes, more transparency of initiatives and budgetary decisions, and more academic and job security.

Collectively, we have missed opportunities. At times, faculty are not fully included in decisions that impact our work, our students, and our daily lives. Shared governance is only strong when all members get a seat at the table. Life has thrown us numerous challenges over the last few years and the weight of those challenges is getting heavy. This alliance could be an opportunity for every teacher, instructor, professor, librarian, and program specialist to make their voices heard.
