## Step 1 - Review Options for Paying for College

_ _	Put time on your side. Applying for and receiving financial aid can take several weeks, even months, depending on your individual circumstances. Apply early and respond promptly to requests for information and action.  Review all available options to assist you in paying for college, including grants, loans, scholarships, workstudy, personal savings, etc. For more information about types of aid, visit <a href="https://www.fhsu.edu/finaid/types-of-aid/">https://www.fhsu.edu/finaid/types-of-aid/</a> .  Estimate your cost to attend college. Your Cost of Attendance is an estimate of the total amount it will cost you to go to college, including tuition and fees, books and supplies, room and board, loan origination fees, travel expenses, parking fees, and personal/miscellaneous expenses. To estimate your COA at FHSU, go to <a href="https://www.fhsu.edu/finaid/Forms/">https://www.fhsu.edu/finaid/Forms/</a> , and select the "Cost of Attendance Worksheet." Step 2 – Apply for Admission to FHSU	
	Apply for admission to FHSU. Visit <a href="https://www.fhsu.edu/admissions/admissions-application/">https://www.fhsu.edu/admissions/admissions-application/</a> _for more information.  NOTE: Financial aid will not be awarded until you have applied for admission and have been accepted as a degree seeking student at FHSU.
	<b>Send all official college academic transcripts</b> to the FHSU Registrar's Office, 600 Park Street, Hays, KS 67601 if you have taken any college coursework at another institution. In most cases, aid cannot be calculated until all transcripts are received and reviewed by the Registrar's Office.
Step 3 – Activate your TigerNetID and Check your Workday/Email Regularly	
	Activate your TigerNetID account by visiting <a href="https://www.fhsu.edu/tigertech/new-student-information/">https://www.fhsu.edu/tigertech/new-student-information/</a> . Upon activating your TigerNetID, you can sign into Workday. Check your Workday account and email regularly for information from FHSU. We send correspondence through a Workday task or by email notification to the email address you provide on the FAFSA.
Step 4 – Apply for Scholarships	
	Apply for FHSU scholarships online at <a href="https://www.fhsu.edu/finaid/Scholarships">https://www.fhsu.edu/finaid/Scholarships</a> . The priority deadline for FHSU Scholarships is November 15, 2023, and the final deadline is February 15, 2024.  Complete the State of Kansas Student Aid Application online at <a href="http://www.kansasregents.org/scholarships_and_grants.">http://www.kansasregents.org/scholarships_and_grants.</a> if you are a State of Kansas Scholar. Priority deadline is May 1, 2024. Step 5 – Apply for Federal Financial Aid – Priority Deadline: April 1, 2024	
	<b>Obtain a Federal Student Aid FSA ID</b> which consists of a username and password combination that allows you to sign your FAFSA electronically. Your FSA ID can be used to sign loan contracts and to access certain information online. You can get your FSA ID as you fill out the FAFSA.
	Complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) online at <a href="studentaid.gov">studentaid.gov</a> . Complete your FAFSA as soon after December 31, 2023 as possible but before the April 1, 2024 priority deadline. Applications are accepted after the priority deadline but limited types of aid are awarded to eligible applicants who apply first. If at all possible, use the Future ACT Direct Data Exchange (FADDX) option when you apply. The FHSU school code is 001915.
Step 6 – Review your FAFSA Submission Summary	

☐ Review your FAFSA Submission Summary which is sent to you via e-mail or postal mail after you file the FAFSA, for accuracy. If

you filed your FAFSA online, you should receive an email and then you can review your FSS.

## Step 7 – Submit Requested Documents to FHSU ☐ Submit any requested documents to FHSU. The FHSU Financial Assistance Office will begin assigning Workday tasks requesting additional information to students who have submitted a FAFSA. Please respond promptly. Contact us if you have questions. Step 8 - Accept or Decline your Financial Aid Offer Accept or Decline your financial offer. Upon receiving notification that your financial aid offer is pending, you will find your award offer in Workday. Please be sure to "accept/ decline" all of your financial aid listed. Any items left at "pending" will result in a delay of your disbursement. Step 9 - Early Enroll in Classes ☐ Early enroll in classes and make sure your financial aid offer matches your enrollment level. If you indicate that you are going to be a full-time student but do not enroll in enough classes, we cannot disburse your aid. Registering in the right classes for your degree program is important, but it is also important to enroll in the correct number of credit hours. Notify the Financial Assistance Office if you no longer plan to attend FHSU. Step 10 - Sign your Loan Master Promissory Note (MPN) and Complete Entrance Counseling, if Applicable ☐ For Direct Loans, sign a Master Promissory Note (MPN) online at studentaid.gov if this is the first Direct Subsidized/Unsubsidized Loan you have received. Complete loan Entrance Counseling online at studentaid.gov. Step 11 - Find a Student Job ☐ Find an on-campus workstudy job if awarded Federal Workstudy. View Federal Workstudy job listings online in Workday by logging into Workday>Career>Find Student Jobs.
