SEVEN STEPS OF THE COLLEGE PLANNING PROCESS


- 1. GATHERING INFORMATION THIS SUMMER!

- 3. MAKING TWO VISITS THIS MAY BE DIFFICULT IF OUT OF STATE, BUT VISITS ARE ALWAYS A GREAT IDEA! EXPLORE VIRTUALLY AND BE READY TO CONNECT WITH THE ADMISSIONS REPRESENTATIVE.
- 4. APPLYING
- 5. INTERVIEWING/ESSAY WRITING/LETTERS OF RECOMMENDATION SOME OF THESE ARE NOT APPLICABLE FOR CERTAIN APPLICATIONS (ESPECIALLY IN STATE SCHOOLS).

- 7. MAKING ACCEPTANCE DECISIONS

"PITFALLS" FOR STUDENTS TO AVOID...

- "I'M APPLYING TO COLLEGE X BECAUSE ALL MY FRIENDS ARE GOING THERE."
- "THERE'S ONLY ONE COLLEGE THAT IS RIGHT FOR ME."
- "ALL COLLEGES ARE THE SAME, SO WHY BOTHER WITH ALL THIS WORK."
- "I'M GOING TO COLLEGE X BECAUSE MY FATHER, MOTHER, BROTHER, ETC. WENT THERE (OR WANTS ME TO GO THERE)."
- "COLLEGE X IS TOO EXPENSIVE FOR ME."
- "I'M NOT APPLYING THERE BECAUSE I'LL GET REJECTED."
- BIGGEST STATEMENT TO AVOID "IF MY NUMBER ONE SCHOOL DOESN'T ACCEPT ME, I'LL BE UNHAPPY FOR THE NEXT 4 YEARS."

OBJECTIVE COLLEGE GUIDES

- PROVIDES INFORMATION FROM A DATABASE # OF STUDENTS, AVERAGE ACT, ETC.)
- USUALLY INDEPENDENT FROM THE COLLEGE SO THEY PROVIDE UNBIASED FACTS.
- EXAMPLES OF OBJECTIVE GUIDES INCLUDE:

SUBJECTIVE COLLEGE GUIDES

- SUBJECTIVE GUIDES ARE BASED ON OPINION AND CAN SOMETIMES BE SWAYED BY THE INFLUENCE OF THE COLLEGE.
- SIMILAR TO OBJECTIVE GUIDES, BUT LIMIT COLLEGES DISCUSSED TO SPECIFIC GROUPS, OR FOCUS ON SPECIFIC TOPICS.
- EXAMPLES OF SUBJECTIVE GUIDES INCLUDE:



WHAT DO COLLEGES LOOK FOR?

- EXTRACURRICULAR/CO-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES
 - COLLEGES ARE INTERESTED IN DEPTH OF COMMITMENT, PERSONAL INITIATIVE, ORIGINALITY, LEADERSHIP ABILITY, AND EVIDENCE OF SOCIAL CONSCIENCE.
 - IT'S NOT THE # OF ACTIVITIES, BUT THE COMMITMENT AND PASSION FOR THOSE ACTIVITIES.
- COMMUNITY SERVICE
 - COLLEGES WANT TO SEE STUDENTS THAT WILL BE GOOD CITIZENS AND STEWARDS WHILE ON CAMPUS AND IN TO THE FUTURE.
- ACADEMIC PERFORMANCE
 - GPA
 - CLASS RANK KAMS/AMS DOES NOT RANK, THOUGH YOUR LOCAL SCHOOL MAY STILL RANK YOU.
 - ACADEMIC RIGOR THIS IS WHERE KAMS/AMS STUDENTS REALLY SHINE!
 - HANDS ON RESEARCH EXPERIENCES
- STANDARDIZED TEST SCORES (ACT/SAT/TOEFL)
 - MANY SCHOOLS ARE TEST OPTIONAL FOR THE CLASS ENTERING COLLEGE IN AUGUST 2023


- RESEARCH THE UNIVERSITIES ON YOUR LIST TO SEE IF THEY REQUIRE A TOEFL.
- SOME SCHOOLS USE THE ENGLISH PORTIONS OF YOUR ACT/SAT TO DECIDE WHETHER OR NOT YOU HAVE MET ENGLISH PROFICIENCY STANDARDS.
- IF THE COLLEGE YOU ARE APPLYING TO DOES NOT REQUIRE A TOEFL SCORE, YOU MAY STILL WANT TO SUBMIT YOUR SCORE, TO SHOW OFF YOUR ENGLISH LANGUAGE SKILLS.... ESPECIALLY IF YOUR SCORE IS GOOD!
- 9 OUT OF 10 U.S. UNIVERSITIES PREFER THE TOEFL TEST OVER OTHER ENGLISH-LANGUAGE TESTS.
- TOEFL HAS OVER 50 TEST DATES PER YEAR AT AUTHORIZED TEST CENTERS. FHSU IS AUTHORIZED TEST CENTER.
- CAN RETAKE THE TEST AS MANY TIMES AS YOU WISH, BUT CANNOT TAKE IT MORE THAN ONCE IN A 12 DAY PERIOD.

HOW MANY SCHOOLS SHOULD I APPLY TOP

- IT ALL DEPENDS ON WHO YOU ARE, WHERE YOU WANT TO GO, AND HOW MUCH YOU WANT TO SPEND ON APPLICATIONS.

 (APPS RANGE FROM \$30-\$130 PER APPLICATION)
- APPLY TO 22 COLLEGES IF YOU KNOW YOU ARE STAYING IN KS.
- IF YOU WANT TO GO OUT OF STATE::
 - APPLYING TO 2-3 "REACH/DREAM" SCHOOLS
 - APPLYING TO 2-3 "MEETS" SCHOOLS
 - APPLYING TO 1-2 "SAFE" SCHOOLS (THESE WOULD BE IN STATE SCHOOLS)
 - INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS MAY WANT TO APPLY TO MORE THAN WHAT IS LISTED.

DIFFERENT ADMISSION PLANS

REGULAR DECISION – TURN IN YOUR APPLICATION BY THE DEADLINE AND THEY LET YOU KNOW BY A SPECIFIED DATE.

- **KU-NOVEMBER 1ST**
- FHSII NOVEMBER 15TH
- **KSU WSU DECEMBER 1ST**
- MANY COLLEGES AROUND THE U.S. DEC. 1ST, DEC. 30TH JAN. 1ST, JAN. 15TH, FEB. 1ST
- ROLLING ADMISSION SCHOOLS REVIEW APPS AS THEY ARE SUBMITTED AND MAKE DECISIONS THROUGHOUT THE ADMISSIONS CYCLE
 (USUALLY 4-6 WEEKS AFTER SUBMITTING APPLICATION).
- EARLY ACTION TURN IN YOUR APP BY THE EARLY DEADLINE AND THE COLLEGE SENDS YOU A DECISION EARLIER. NON-BINDING AGREEMENT. (OCTOBER 1 AND 15.... NOVEMBER 1)
- EARLY DECISION A BINDING AGREEMENT. MAKE SURE YOU ARE COMMITTED TO GOING THERE. EARLY DECISION IS AN AGREEMENT BETWEEN
 YOU AND THE COLLEGE. IF ACCEPTED, YOU WILL HAVE TO WITHDRAW ALL OTHER COLLEGE APPLICATIONS AND ATTEND THAT COLLEGE. CAN ONLY
 APPLY AS EARLY DECISION TO ONE COLLEGE. (OCTOBER 1 AND 15... NOVEMBER 1)

- A MILITARY ACADEMY EDUCATION IS ALL EXPENSE PAID AND IS VALUED WELL OVER \$300,000.
- JUNIOR YEAR IS THE TIME TO CONSIDER THEM AND BEGIN PRELIMINARY APPLICATION PROCESS IN SPRING.
- MID-SEPTEMBER OF SENIOR YEAR IS OFTEN THE DEADLINE FOR CONGRESSIONAL NOMINATION APPLICATIONS.

ESSAY PROMPTS

- START OVER THE SUMMER MONTHS.
- ESSAY PROMPTS
 - REVIEW ESSAY PROMPTS FROM COMMON APP, COALITION, ETC.
 - REFLECT OVER THE PROMPTS AND REFLECT ON MOMENTS IN YOUR LIFE THAT CAN EXPRESS WHO YOU ARE.
 - THINK ABOUT MEMORIES WITH VIVID DETAILS/DESCRIPTORS.
 - THINK ABOUT EVENTS IN YOUR LIFE THAT HAVE SHAPED YOU.
 - THINK ABOUT HOW SOMETHING HAS INFLUENCED YOUR LIFE AND HOW IT DRIVES YOU TODAY... AND IN TO THE FUTURE.
 - SUGGESTION: TRY NOT TO WRITE ABOUT WHAT KAMS/AMS IS WITHIN YOUR ESSAY. THERE IS USUALLY A SECTION AT THE END OF APPLICATIONS FOR YOU TO DETAIL THE UNIQUENESS OF OUR PROGRAM. HOWEVER, IF THERE IS AN EVENT OR SOMETHING THAT HAS CHANGED YOUR LIFE WITHIN KAMS/AMS, YOU CAN DISCUSS THAT IN THE ESSAY PORTION.
 - COLLEGES ALREADY HAVE YOUR ACT/SAT, GPA, ETC. USE THE ESSAY TO CONNECT WITH THE UNIVERSITY AS PERSON.

COMMON APPLICATION ESSAY PROMPTS

THE 2022-2023 COMMON APPLICATION ESSAY PROMPTS ARE AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. SOME STUDENTS HAVE A BACKGROUND, IDENTITY, INTEREST, OR TALENT THAT IS SO MEANINGFUL THEY BELIEVE THEIR APPLICATION WOULD BE INCOMPLETE WITHOUT IT. IF THIS SOUNDS LIKE YOU, THEN PLEASE SHARE YOUR STORY.
- 2. THE LESSONS WE TAKE FROM OBSTACLES WE ENCOUNTER CAN BE FUNDAMENTAL TO LATER SUCCESS. RECOUNT A TIME WHEN YOU FACED A CHALLENGE, SETBACK, OR FAILURE. HOW DID IT AFFECT YOU, AND WHAT DID YOU LEARN FROM THE EXPERIENCE?
- 3. REFLECT ON A TIME WHEN YOU QUESTIONED OR CHALLENGED A BELIEF OR IDEA. WHAT PROMPTED YOUR THINKING? WHAT WAS THE OUTCOME?
- 4. REFLECT ON SOMETHING THAT SOMEONE HAS DONE FOR YOU THAT HAS MADE YOU HAPPY OR THANKFUL IN A SURPRISING WAY.
 HOW HAS THIS GRATITUDE AFFECTED OR MOTIVATED YOU?
- 5. DISCUSS AN ACCOMPLISHMENT, EVENT, OR REALIZATION THAT SPARKED A PERIOD OF PERSONAL GROWTH AND A NEW UNDERSTANDING OF YOURSELF OR OTHERS.
- 6. DESCRIBE A TOPIC, IDEA, OR CONCEPT YOU FIND SO ENGAGING THAT IT MAKES YOU LOSE ALL TRACK OF TIME. WHY DOES IT CAPTIVATE YOU? WHAT OR WHO DO YOU TURN TO WHEN YOU WANT TO LEARN MORE?
- 7. SHARE AN ESSAY ON ANY TOPIC OF YOUR CHOICE. IT CAN BE ONE YOU'VE ALREADY WRITTEN, ONE THAT RESPONDS TO A DIFFERENT PROMPT, OR ONE OF YOUR OWN DESIGN.

COALITION ESSAY PROMPTS



Essay prompts

- Tell a story from your life, describing an experience that either demonstrates your character or helped to shape it.
- 2. What interests or excites you? How does it shape who you are now or who you might become in the future?
- 3. Describe a time when you had a positive impact on others. What were the challenges? What were the rewards?
- 4. Has there been a time when an idea or belief of yours was questioned? How did you respond? What did you learn?

- 3. What would you say is your greatest talent or skill? How have you developed and demonstrated that talent over time?
- 4. Describe how you have taken advantage of a significant educational opportunity or worked to overcome an educational barrier you have faced.
- 5. Describe the most significant challenge you have faced and the steps you have taken to overcome this challenge. How has this challenge affected your academic achievement?
- 6. Think about an academic subject that inspires you. Describe how you have furthered this interest inside and/or outside of the classroom.
- 7. What have you done to make your school or your community a better place?
- 8. Beyond what has already been shared in your application, what do you believe makes you stand out as a strong candidate for admissions to the University of California?
