


Investing in Purpose










Strategic Plan Update

- Establish a working definition for professional development activities supporting best practices in teaching, scholarship, and service
- Develop a minimum of three high-priority, asynchronous professional development workshops





Goal 2: Student Success

Create opportunities for all students and empower them to identify, evaluate, and achieve their goals while becoming engaged global citizens.

- Hire a coordinator to design a data informed plan to improve on-campus transfer student persistence
- Complete the uploading of a majority of academic program plans into Workday in preparation of the spring 2021 launch to improve enrollment decisions






- Improve student communication tools for effective recruiting

- Inventory the University's civic learning and engagement activities for the Carnegie community engagement classification




2019-2020 Forward Thinking Strategies








Other Decisions

Facilities Update: Completed Fall Projects



Memorial Union Restroom Improvements Union Funds

Remodeled the first and second floor men's and women's restrooms. Added a new gender-neutral restroom on the second floor.



Memorial Union Ballroom Ceiling Replacement Union Funds

Replaced the existing ceiling along with new lighting and audio/visual upgrades.



Schmidt Foundation Center for Art & Design University Funds

New facility for the department of art & design. Renovations to the old power plant for a new art gallery.



Lewis Field Restroom Addition University Funds

New restrooms for men and women at west stadium.



Akers Energy Center Boiler Replacement R&R Funding

Replaced two 1200 HP boilers and associated mechanical equipment.



Dwight Drive / Lewis Drive Paving Replacement R&R & Parking Funds

Replaced deteriorating portions of Dwight and Lewis drives and add accessible ramps.

Facilities Update: Planned Spring Projects



Fischli-Wills Center <u>for Student Sucess</u> Private Funds / Tuition & Bonds

Construction documents are now complete. Construction will commence in the spring.



Rarick Hall Renovation University and R&R Funding

Repurpose vacated space for campus growth after the departure of the department of Art and Design. Design commenced August 2019.



Albertson Hall Upper Level Roof Repairs R&R Funding

Replace deteriorated modified bitumen roofing at upper level, north wing area, with new insulation and EPDM roofing membrane. Work to begin as weather allows.



Sternberg Meseum Chiller Replacement R&R Funding

The removal and replacement of the building chiller unit. Work to commence in the spring.



Gross Coliseum Roof Replacement R&R Funding

Replacement of the copper roof on the coliseum with new steel metal roofing panels. Work is planned to commence in spring.



Sheridan Hall Masonry Cleaning and Sealing R&R Funding

Clean and seal exterior limestone walls. Work is to commence in the spring




