FRONT DESK

Desk Hours

Each hall desk is open numerous hours during the weekdays and selected hours during the weekends to accommodate the residents' needs. Please check the specific desk hours for each hall at the front desk.

Mail

Mail is delivered every morning except Sundays and holidays. All packages need to be signed for at the desk before they are given to the resident. Mailboxes are assigned alphabetically. Stamps may be purchased at the front desk. Campus mail is picked up from the University Mail Room every weekday. Please use the designated slots provided at the front desk for outgoing mail. Campus mail does not require postage. Your campus address is:

YOUR NAME YOUR HALL HAYS, KS 67601 Each resident will be assigned either a mailbox key or a mailbox combination when he or she moves in. It costs \$2 to receive a mailbox combination again or \$10 to receive a new mailbox key.

If your address should change, be sure to provide your forwarding address to the hall staff and to any person, business or publisher who sends you mail regularly. The hall staff will forward first class mail for 60 days. Third class mail (magazines, newspapers and other periodicals) to which you have a paid subscription will be forward for 90 days.

RESIDENCE HALL ASSOCIATION

The Residence Hall Association (RHA) acts as the official voice for students living on campus. RHA serves as a link between on-campus residents and the administration to provide input about the dining services and overall functioning of the residence halls. RHA also provides programming for all the halls and is in charge of the campus movie channel (channel 21). Keep your eyes open for postings during move in for information on upcoming activities and meetings.

COMMUNITY SERVICE BENEFIT

Residential Life wants each resident to participate fully in their community and encourages involvement with their Community Council, Residence Hall Association (RHA) or the peer Judicial Review Board (JBoard). Individuals who are elected to serve on the executive board of their Community Council, RHA or are selected to serve on the JBoard will earn a 10% discount on their room contract (meal plan is excluded). This discount will be processed at the end of each semester to every individual who remains active throughout the semester. If you have additional questions regarding this discount contact your Hall Director or Community Manager.

HALL SERVICES

Housekeeping

Each hall provides regular houskeeping services in commons areas Monday through Friday. Please do your part by cleaning up after yourself in the halls, lounges, and bathrooms. Brooms, dustpans, and some other supplies can be found in the student supply closets located by each bathroom. Vacuums can be checked out from the front desk at your convenience. McMindes and Wiest residents must take all trash to the trash room/chute. Agnew residents have dumpsters by the back door. Dumping trash and pizza boxes from your room in the bathroom or lounge receptacles is NOT acceptable. Violators will be sanctioned by the Judicial Board.

Maintenance

If a maintenance problem occurs in your room or in the hall, please report it to the front desk of your hall. If you feel that the maintenance issue has not been resolved correctly and/or in a timely manner, please let a hall staff member know. Remember, we cannot help you unless we are informed of the problem.

Locked Out

If you lock yourself out, go to the desk and ask to be let in your room. Be prepared to show your ID. We will not let you in someone else's room for any reason. Excessive or repetitive lock-outs may result in disciplinary action

Lost keys and Lock Changes

If you lose your key, notify the Hall Director immediately. You will be charged \$50 for the room key/replacement of the lock. The cost for replacement of a mailbox key is \$10 and the cost for a pass key is \$100.

Alarm clocks

A staff member must enter a resident's room to shut off an alarm clock.

Excessive occurences may result in disciplinary action.

HALL FACILITIES

Vending

Vending machines are located in each residence hall. If you lose money in one of the machines, go to the front desk for a refund.

Refrigerators/Microwaves

All resident-owned refrigerators in rooms must not be more than eight years old and less than a total of five cubic feet in size.

Cooking

The residence halls are not equipped with the kind of wiring, plumbing or ventilation systems which permit cooking in student rooms. Each hall has a kitchenette area that residents may use for cooking. Residents are expected to clean up after themselves.

Each floor is equipped with a common microwave oven for residents to use. Only microwave safe dishes and utensils may be utilized and food is not to be left unattended. Failure to follow appropriate cooking methods may result in excessive heat/smoke production which will trigger the hall fire alarm system. Intentional disregard to cooking methods or failure to adhere to reasonable safety procedures which results in fire safety system activation will result in disciplinary action for a fire safety violation.

Ice Machine

Each residence hall is equipped with an ice machine for the residents' use. Please keep in mind that the ice is for every residents' use and should not be used as a personal ice box for food and/or other items.

Cleaning Supplies Closet

Cleaning supply closets are available for residents. These closets contain a variety of housekeeping equipment to be used by the residents for cleaning their rooms.

Laundry Room

Coin and card operated washers and dryers are located in the basement of McMindes and Wiest Halls. These machines are for use by the residents of that community only. If a machine is not working properly, or if you lose money in one of the machines, report the machine number to the front desk person, who will give you an immediate refund.

Guest Facilities

Please refer to the Visitation Policy for each hall to determine when and where guests are permitted. Each hall has specific facilities that are available for use by guests. Guests of the opposite gender must use the

restroom and shower facilities on the appropriate gender floor. For more information, please contact the Hall Director.

Bike Racks

Bikes may be parked in the bike racks located near the exits of each hall. Bikes parked in any other location will be removed at your expense. Register your bike with the University Police Department at the beginning of the school year. Bikes not claimed at move out will be disposed of by the University.

Living Rooms/Lounges

The living rooms and lounges are public multi-purpose rooms for residents and visitors to use. Both can be used as a waiting area and for hall programs. Special reservations for meetings and other events can be made for these rooms by contacting the Hall Director in cooperation with the community council.

Cash-to-Card Machine

Located across from the front desk in the main lobby of McMindes and Wiest Hall, the C-to-C machine can be used to check an account balance or to add credit to the University TigerCard vending strip.

Copy Machine

McMindes Hall has the only public copy machine in the residence halls. The coin-operated copy machine is located across from the front desk near the east elevators.

HALL POLICY

Statement of Values

FHSU is committed to providing a living environment in which students feel accepted and supported. Residents have the right to enjoy individual freedoms without regard to differences in ethnicity, race, national origin, disability, age, religion, political affiliation, personal belief, sexual orientation or lifestyle.

Resident's Rights

Each resident has the right to study and sleep within his or her own room. These rights precede the rights of guests, other individual rights or community rights.

Judicial Board

The Residential Life Judicial Board (JBoard) exists to promote a positive group living environment by providing a means to assure compliance with the established policies of the Department of Residential Life and FHSU in all of our communities. The JBoard operates within the boundaries of the communities which provide its power and is committed to provide fair

treatment of each person who appears before the board.

Members of the JBoard are drawn from each Residential Life community. Residents interested in serving as a member of the JBoard apply in the fall to the JBoard Adviser. Specific application information is provided at the beginning of each academic year. Those individuals who are selected to serve on the JBoard receive specialized training and remain seated throughout the academic year if their performance is satisfactory and their conduct history remains clear. JBoard members will receive a 10% room reduction (meal plan not included) at the end of each semester.

The Hall Director makes the decision as to whether a policy violation is major or minor and as to whether it is to be reviewed by the JBoard, the Hall Director, the Director of Residential Life or the Office of Student Affairs. Any time a resident is notified to appear before the JBoard, (s) he must do so. All communication with the involved student(s) will be via the students scatcat email account. If the resident fails to appear, his/her case will be reviewed by the JBoard based on the evidence in hand.

All JBoard decisions may be appealed to the Hall Director if the student involved feels that the assigned sanction(s) is inordinately severe for the violation or if (s)he feels that the finding of responsibility was made in error and (s)he can produce new information. Failure to appear at the original JBoard hearing renders the right of appeal null and void.

Failure to complete sanctions as assigned will result in an escalation of disciplinary status, a finding of non-compliance and may result in additional sanctions being assigned. Non-compliance represents a violation of any probationary status invoked by the JBoard or through an administrative hearing.

Drugs

Manufacturing, possessing, selling, transmitting, using, or being party to any activity involving an illegal drug, controlled substance or drug paraphernalia is a violation of Fort Hays State University policy as well as a violation of the law. Suspected violations of this policy are reported to the University Police. Please refer to the Campus Directory and Student Handbook for detailed information.

Gambling

Kansas state law prohibits any gambling on state property. The residence halls are state property; therefore no gambling is allowed anywhere in the halls. Community councils and/or RHA may sponsor casino themed programming which involve no monetary component.

Alcohol

Possession and consumption of alcoholic beverages are expressly prohibited in all of our residence halls regardless of age

Guidelines for Violations of Alcohol Policy

Consumption/Intoxication:

In the presence of a violation of policy and/or state or federal law.

1st Incident: 6 month RL probation*, paper or poster, alcohol safety school*, community restitution if appropriate

2nd Incident: University probation 1 year*, removal from community, research paper, alcohol evaluation and compliance with recommendations*, community restitution if appropriate

3rd Incident: possible University suspension, removal from RL with no financial release

Providing:

1st Incident: 1 year RL probation, research paper, MIP/UDP involvement*, alcohol safety school*, community restitution if appropriate

2nd Incident: University probation (indefinite)*, removal from RL without financial release, alcohol evaluation and compliance with recommendations*, community restitution if appropriate

3rd Incident: referral to Vice President of Student Affairs for possible University suspension

Incapacitation:

1st Incident: 6 month RL probation*, alcohol safety school*, alcohol evaluation and compliance with recommendations*, educational sanction, community restitution if appropriate

2nd Incident: University probation 1 year*, removal from community and/ or RL, community restitution if appropriate

3rd Incident: referral to Vice President of Student Affairs for possible University suspension

Items marked with * are mandatory unless compelling circumstances need to be considered. All other sanctions are discretionary and can be applied according to JBoard or hearing officers' determination.

Professional Staff members and JBoards may place students of RL probation and remove from community. Recommendations for University probation and/or termination of housing conract must be made to RL Director.

Tobacco

Smoking and the use of tobacco products are prohibited in all Fort Hays State University buildings and facilities, as well as any other designated

exterior spaces. All entrances to University buildings will be non-smoking within a radius of 30 feet.

Complaints concerning violations of these regulations will be submitted to a committee formed by members of the Department of Facilities.

This policy will be effective June 1, 2008 and enforced in agreement with state statutes K.S.A. 21-4009 through 21-4013.

Solicitation

Solicitation is not permitted in Fort Hays State University Residential communities, including parking lots. Anyone observed to be engaging in solicitation activities, including campaigners and salespeople, should be informed that such activity is prohibited and that they must cease immediately. They should be reported to the Residence Hall Director, who will inform the Office of Student Affairs.

It is against university policy for anyone to solicit, peddle, canvas, or otherwise engage in contacting faculty, staff, or students for any purpose not specifically approved in advance by university authorities. The sale of products and/or services by individuals, partnerships, corporations, or other such entities not associated with or related to the university is prohibited. Request for exceptions to this policy may be made to the Vice President of Student Affairs.

Inappropriate Behavior

If a resident's behavior becomes disruptive to the community environment, sanctions up to and including the resident's removal from the floor, residence hall, or university may be imposed.

Intentional reckless & negligent damage

Residents are expected to keep their room/apartment in a neat, clean and sanitary condition. This includes clearing all garbage or debris in, on or about their residence. Failure to maintain appropriate reasonable standards cleanliness, pest control or sanitation may result in disciplinary action including termination of the housing contract. Residents may be held responsible for all common areas within their community. Residents will be responsible for the full cost of the repair of damages to their room which results from intentional, reckless, gross negligent or negligent acts. All residents within the same community shall be jointly liable and responsible for the full cost of repair of damages to any common areas within the residence or community unless the individual who caused the damage can be identified. Excessive levels of damage or vandalism may result in disciplinary action which may include relocation or the termination of the housing contract without financial release.

Non-Compliancet

Windows /Screens

Any resident who removes the screen from a window for any reason will be assessed a \$50.00 damage charge and face disciplinary action. Anyone throwing items from a window, will face disciplinary action and/or criminal charges.

Smoking/Incense/Candles

All residence halls are smoke free. Smoking is permitted outside the building. Use of incense and/or open flames in the residence halls are prohibited. Candle warmers are permitted and encouraged. (See also 'Tobacco' for University Policy)

Propping of Doors

All residence hall exterior entrance doors are locked up each night at 11 pm. Do NOT prop open any outside door. This action may permit possible dangerous and undesirable individuals to enter the building. This may also allow animals to enter the building. If a resident or guest is caught propping open an outside door, they will face disciplinary action.

Visitation/Escort Policy

The visitation hours and escort policies differ from hall to hall, and are listed in detail below. General guidelines include consideration of all residents when hosting guests. Consideration is necessary from visitors when using hall facilities. Males must use male restrooms and females must use female restrooms. The resident will be held responsible for any inconveniences or disturbances that his or her guest(s) cause. Also, please respect the rights of the roommate when having visitors. Any staff member may ask a visitor to leave if the guest is causing a disturbance. Hall residents found in violation of the visitation policy will face Judicial Board action. Residents will be held responsible for the actions of their guests.

Wiest Hall:

- Open visitation 24 hrs.
- All guests must have escort.
- Overnight guests must be of same sex and be registered with staff; roommate must approve any overnight guest

McMindes Hall:

- All guests must have escort
- Overnight guests must be of same sex and be registered with staff; roommate must approve any overnight guest.

Visitation: Sunday - Thursday: open visitation 10:00 AM - 1:00 AM

Friday- Saturday: Open visitation 24 hrs.

Any guest entering MM between 11:00 PM and 6:00 AM must

check in at front desk and leave ID.

Quiet Hours

Quiet hours are enforced from 10 pm to 10 am Sunday through Thursday. Quiet hours run midnight to 10 am Friday and Saturday. During this time, the doors should be closed if you are playing music, listening to your TV, or having a conversation. The volume of your TV, music and conversation should be kept at a low level. The hall staff respects your maturity and common sense, so if another residents asks you to please not be loud while he or she studies, you are expected to be cooperative with the request. Likewise, if another resident's noise is bothering you, you have the right to politely ask that he or she be quiet. During finals week, quiet hours will be 24 hours a day, beginning 6 pm the Friday before finals. Sanctions will be left to the judgment of the Judicial Board.

Weapons

Weapons and ammunition may not be kept in individual rooms. The possession/use of weapons which endanger health or safety of yourself or others is sufficient cause for immediate dismissal from the residence hall without financial release and referral to the Vice President of Student Affairs for further disciplinary review.

YOUR ROOM

Room Personalization

Residents are encouraged to customize their rooms in whatever manner makes them feel most at home, provided that all alterations to the physical structure are approved by the Hall Director.

Public Viewing Areas

The outside of room doors and the outside of windows are considered public viewing areas. Residents are encouraged to be considerate of the other members of the community when displaying material in these areas. Any decorations used must not protrude beyond the door frame itself. The Residential Life staff may ask you to remove items determined to be fire or saftey hazards from your room to doorway. Anything determined to represent hate speech will be removed and the resident responsible will face disciplinary action.

Furniture

Every room is equipped with a bed, study chair, desk, closet and possibly a bulletin board for each resident. If a room is missing any furniture, it will be noted at check-in by a staff member. Do not leave room furniture in the hallway. Residential Life will not provide storage for any furniture a resident removes. Failure to return all Residential Life furniture to the room at check-out will result in replacement charges being assessed.

Carpet

A resident may put carpet in his or her room as long as it is not taped or glued to the floor. If it covers more than half of the room, the carpet must have a flame spread rating of 78 percent or less.

Movie Channel and Bulletin Board

Channel 21 on the cable television is the university movie channel and public bulletin board. The movies shown are selected by the Residence Hall Association (RHA), and they welcome any suggestions or requests. A schedule of the movies being played will be posted in the residence halls.

Pets

No pets of any kind are allowed for reasons of health and safety, with the exception of fish in aquariums of 10 gallons or less.

Common Area Furniture

All common area furniture should stay in the common area. Removal of common area furnishings will be viewed as theft. Those responsible will face disciplinary action.

Student Wireless

To connect to the wireless access offered by FHSU, follow these steps:

- 1. Select TigerNetStudent as the Network SSID
- 2. Open an Internet browser
- 3. Enter your TigerTracks username and password
- 4. Restart your computer (initial registration only)

EMERGENCY PROCEDURES

Fire Alarms/Fire Safety

During a fire alarm all residents must leave the building and stay out until the building has been secured. When you leave, shut and lock your door. You will be notified when you can re-enter the building. Do not enter the building until you are told by the hall staff that it is safe to do so. The silencing of the alarm is not permission to re-enter the building. Failure to

leave will result in a \$50 fine. Please see the student Discipline section of Rights and Restrictions.

Each residence room has a smoke alarm. Each building is equipped with a complete state-of-the-art smoke and fire alarm system. These devices exist for the safety of all residents and any tampering with or misuse of these systems is considered a serious offense against the members of the residential community. Offenders are subject to sanctions up to and including criminal prosecution. Tampering with fire safety equipment (including but not limited to) fire extinguishers, sprinkler heads, smoke detectors, and fire alarms may result in a \$250 fine and disciplinary sanctions which may include termination of housing contract.

Tornados/Severe Weather

Radio and television weather services typically issue tornado warnings with reference to city and county. Fort Hays State University is located in the City of Hays in Ellis County. In the event a tornado warning for Hays or Ellis County is broadcasted by the radio and television weather services or is indicated by the sounding of the tornado siren, all residents and visitors are advised to:

- (1) Leave residence rooms:
- (2) Close and lock the door:
- (3) Move immediately to seek shelter in the basement;
- (4) Take the following items with you if they are immediately available, pillow to protect your head, flashlight, and a battery powered radio

If there is not enough time to move to the basement, all residents and visitors are advised to leave residence rooms, close and lock the door and seek shelter in a hallway on the lowest level of the building they can safely reach. Interior rooms without windows, closets and similar spaces are good choices for quick shelter. Stay away from windows and all other glass.

In the event of a tornado, residence hall staff will have immediate authority. Please follow their directions. Only hall staff may issue an all-clear message or any further information.

If you have a question about any part of this information, please contact the residence hall staff. Failure to follow instructions may result in disciplinary action.

OTHER INFORMATION

Check-In/Check-Out

Upon arrival to your assigned residence hall, you will be checked in by a staff member. When you leave, a specific check-out procedure will be

followed. Your room must be left in the same general condition as it was when you moved in. When you are ready to check out, even if it is not the end of the semester, see your RA/RM. An improper check-out is a \$50 fine. Failure to follow check-out procedures may result in an improper check-out charge being assessed. All charges for damages and/or missing furnishing will be assessed to the resident's Student Fiscal Service account.

Housing Payments

Housing payments should be made online through the TigerTracks portal. If you have questions about payments, call Student Fiscal Services at 628-4252 or 628-4461, or visit them in Sheridan Hall, Room 110G.

University Break Periods

Residents in good standing who are under continuing contracts may remain in the residence hall during scheduled break periods and between terms of study for no additional charge if permitted by the Hall Director. Residents who will be staying during any break when the hall is closed must first sign up at the front desk. Important information about staying in the hall during break will be given to the resident at that time. If a resident does not already possess a pass key, one will be checked out at the time of sign up with a required \$10 deposit.

During break periods, both residence hall staffing and services are reduced. The number of people in the halls in general is also greatly reduced




