Praxis II Exams for Kansas Licensure

The Praxis II Exams are standardized tests candidates must successfully complete to be licensed to teach in the state of Kansas. The Principles of Learning and Teaching (PLT) exams measure general pedagogical knowledge. The <u>Subject Assessments</u> measure general and subject-specific knowledge and teaching skills. **Kansas requires a passing score from one of the four PLT Assessments <u>AND</u> the appropriate <u>Subject Assessment(s)</u> for the initial educator license. Each state has their own licensure requirements. The programs offered through FHSU prepare you for licensure in the state of Kansas. If you live in a different state or country, contact your country's or state's Department of Education to determine license transfer requirements.**

PRAXIS II EXAMS

Principles of Learning & Teaching Exam (PLT) required score: 160

- Principles of Learning & Teaching: Grades K-6 (Elementary Education majors)
- Principles of Learning & Teaching: Early Childhood (Early Childhood Unified majors)
- Principles of Learning & Teaching: Grades 5-9 or Grades 7-12 (Secondary Education majors)

Subject Assessments required score: Varied (dependent upon subject)

- Elementary Education: Curriculum, Instruction, & Assessment (Elementary Education majors)
- Education of Young Children (Early Childhood Unified majors)
- Secondary Education majors will take a Subject Assessment in their specific content area
- Special Education: Core Knowledge & Mild to Moderate Applications (Special Education minors)

REGISTRATION: Register for tests at www.ets.org/praxis/register. If you wish to take it at FHSU, you can choose the Hays location – it will be administered at the Kelly Center, Picken Hall Room 117A. All tests are computer-based. Regardless of where you take it, choose Forthags State University as a score recipient.
