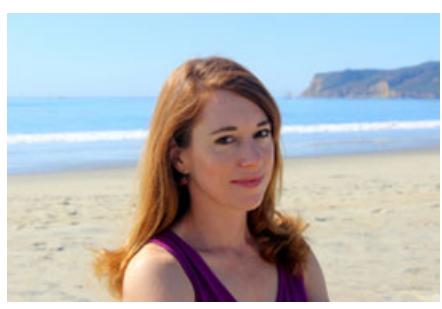


FHSU student seeks state office

Reminder: Author Andria Williams book signing set for April 19

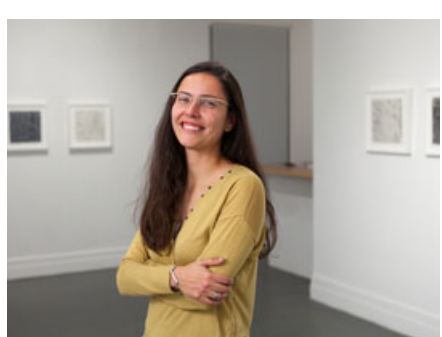

Nominees must demonstrate positive womanhood through breaking gender stereotypes, taking action and leading by example while making outstanding contributions to the community. [More](#)

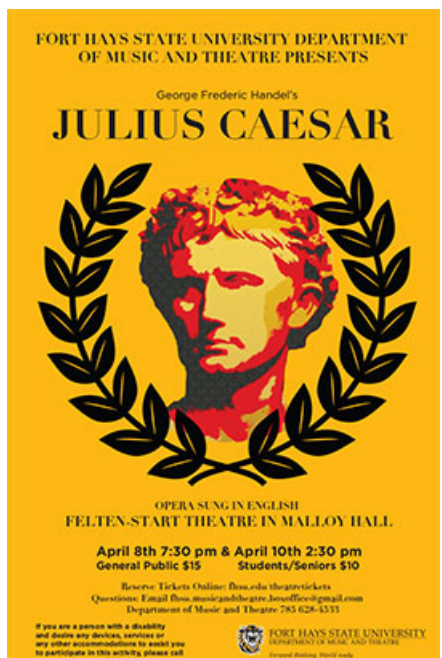


Robotic battle

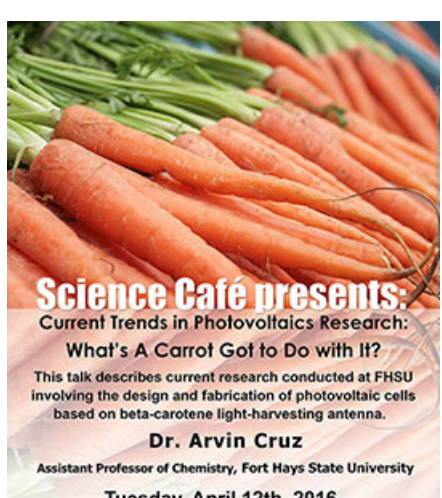
