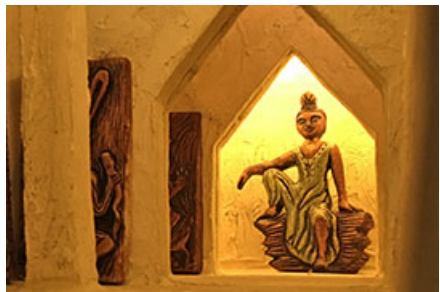

FHSU to go tobacco free on July 1, 2016

As of July 1, 2016, Fort Hays State University will enforce a tobacco-free campus, prohibiting the use of all tobacco products on all areas of campus.

FDA-approved smoking cessation products, such as nicotine patches or gum, are excluded from the ban. Smoking is currently allowed in specified FHSU parking lots. [More](#)
