Jon Armstrong moves from admissions to post with FHSU Foundation

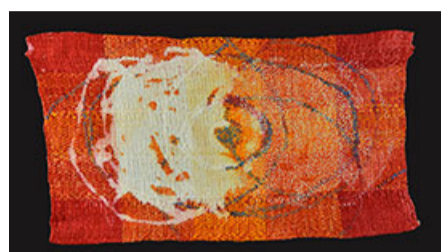

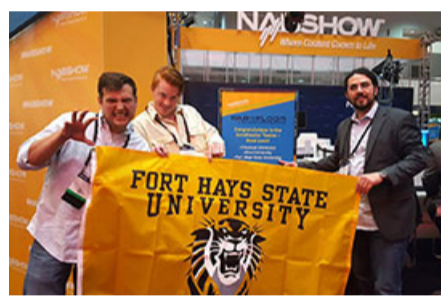
