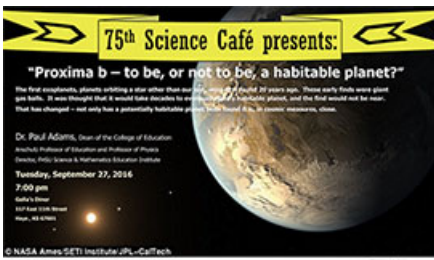
Professors publish article in APA Education Directorate
