Traveling Trophy

- The Traveling Trophy was presented to Dane Lonnon, Director of Student Fiscal Services.
- Dennis thanked Dane for the Student Fiscal Services Office partnership with the Registrar's Office in making the concurrent enrollment process better each semester.

Introduction

- Traylor Kriley introduced Dale Ano, Assistant Director of Student Engagement.
- Dale will be working with learning communities and assisting with Center for Student Success programming. Dale's office is located in the Student Success Center on the second floor.

Academic Affairs Update

- Jill thanked Student Affairs for their help and assistance with fall the commencement ceremonies. The May ceremonies are being planned.
- FHSU's new General Education program will be launched Fall 2023. This past fall, six faculty worked on the general education program. Working now to implement the program into Workday. Training sessions will start in January with advisors and department chairs. Training will be offered for Student Affairs staff on February 2. An invite will be sent out. The state-wide general education program will be 34 or 35 hours. FHSU's program will be 34 credit hours. Not all students will be automatically moved into the new general education program. Each year, students are entered into a catalog program. For those current students who want to opt into the program, will be manually loaded. FHSU will be the first regent institution to kick off the new gen ed program. Other regent schools will start the new gen ed program Fall 2024.
- RPK group provided a presentation at the Regents level and for Fort Hays. Jill has shared the report with Joey and Dennis. Regents are accepting feedback at this time.
- College of Arts, Humanities, and Social Sciences reorganization was approved at regents in December. The Interim Dean and Jill are working with the logistics to be

in place by the start of new fiscal year. The college will consist of five units, with each unit with a little bit different leadership structure.

- Centralized advising is nearing a year of being implemented. Craig, Patti, Angela and Jill have been meeting to make improvements to the advising model at FHSU.
- A search firm was hired to conduct the search for the Dean of Arts, Humanities, and Social Sciences. On-campus interviews will be held the end of February.

Enrollment Update

• As of today, we are down 2.8 percent for the Spring 2023 semester in both headcount and SEH.

Affiliation Update

- Both tech colleges and Board of Regents have approved the Affiliation proposal moving forward.
- Subgroups will be set up in February.

Student Affairs Alignment

- SALT has been reviewing the alignment of the Division of Student Affairs with the direction we are going and with the Board of Regents directives.
- Janie Gilmore has left the position as Assistant Director of Enrollment Management.
- Kathleen Cook, Director of Retention and Persistence, will move under Enrollment Management. Kathleen will work on evaluation of data and how to implement best practices with our data.
- The vacant Assistant Director position will move under the Student Success cluster.
- Dennis and the Enrollment Management team will concentrate on recruitment and retention data systems and management. Taylor's Student Success team will focus on implementing programs and supporting services. This realignment will provide opportunities for our teams to focus on the systems and processes in their areas.

HESA Transition

- The Division of Student Affairs will be taking over the management of the HESA program.
- Phillip Olt will still be a part of the program and will not take on the role of Program Coordinator of JROTC. He will continue to teach online HESA courses.
- Taylor will be taking on the role of Program Coordinator of the HESA program.

Food Pantry

- The Food Pantry has been moved from the Forsyth Library to the Chestnut Room on the first floor of the Memorial Union. Signage is being created to be posted outside the room.
- Health & Wellness Services is working with SGA to schedule a press conference.
- The University received a \$80,000 grant this fiscal year which needs to be spent by the end of June 2023. Funds from the grant are to be used on food and personal care items.
