Enrollment Update

- The first newsletter from the Registrar's Office was sent out to the campus community today. Plan to continue to send out newsletters.
- Spring 2023 enrollment compared to 20th day last year
 - On-campus is down 1.66 percent
 - Online is down 4.9 percent, but are up 155 new online students.
 - For the Spring 2023 semester, we are down 3.4 percent in enrollment. We projected Spring 2023 enrollment to be down 4.5 percent.
- Fall 2023 housing applications are up for freshman and transfer students. Scholarship awards are up compared to last year. Freshman and graduate admits are up. Transfer and returning student applications are flat.
