Traveling Trophy

- The traveling trophy was presented to Jill Arensdorf, Provost.
- Joey thanked Jill and the entire division of Academic Affairs as they play an integral part of what we do in Student Affairs.

Academic Affairs Update

- The Language Company, who is our ESL provider, does not have enough oncampus students to make it financially to be here on campus. Their last day on the FHSU campus is Friday, March 24. With their departure, FHSU will no longer have a face-to-face ESL program. FHSU will continue to work with their online program.
- The general education plan officially rolled out for Fall 2023, with the exception of our international partner schools. Opt-in process for current students is going well.
 A few updates have been made to the plan and have been updated on the website.
- Announcement will be made soon for the new Dean of Arts, Humanities, and Social Sciences.
- FHSU has been looking at data analysis platforms to track data across FHSU. We
 have a group working on an RFP for a product to do this for FHSU. The Board of
 Regents is also looking at doing a system-wide product for all regent's schools.
 FHSU is waiting on guidance from the board on how we can move forward to
 choose the best product for FHSU.
- There is also an RFP to digitize the course catalog. On-campus presentations are being scheduled.
- At the Chief Academic Officer meeting, a policy revision was approved to remove the 60-hour transfer in from another institution requirement. It will now go through the approval process at the Board of Regents. If approved, a student receiving a bachelor's degree will need to have 120 hours of which 45 hours being upper division.
- Architects are working on mock-ups for the Forsyth Library renovation. Plans will be finalized over the summer and request for bids will happen Fall 2023 with construction starting in Spring 2024. Movement of services during construction are still be discussed.
- The Radiologic Technology is undergoing a campus site visit from JRCERT, March 23 & 24. The Rad Tech program has expanded their program to 45 students for 2023-24.

VPSA Update

- K-Board meeting was held on March 22. The legislation process and funding for the next fiscal year was discussed.
- At the Chief Student Affairs meeting, fee increases were discussed. FHSU is the only University not seeking fee increases for FY24. Other schools will be asking for a 2 to 4 percent increase in fees.
- The regent VP's met with Blake, Chair of the Board of Regents. They discussed the higher criteria that is required to be a licensed psychologist in Kansas compared to other states.
- The Cambodia trip over Spring Break went well. There is an opportunity for FHSU to be the main partner for the American University of Phnom Penh. The President of American University is one of the 12 ministers to the Prime Minster of Cambodia. The school is working on adding more academic programs. They will have over 100 students enrolled at FHSU for Fall 2023. School enrollment is currently at 1,000 students and plans to expand to 2,000. They want FHSU to open an office on their campus.

FHSU Digital Master Plan

- Andrew Feldstein leads the FHSU Digital Master Plan Steering committee.
- The committee will be meeting with consultants on April 4 @ 3:30 pm and April 6 @ 10 am.

Ramadan
