# **Orientation Update**

#### **VPSA Update**

- WorkFlex Policy
  - Policy was presented to SLT. The policy has not been approved. Feedback should be sent to your AVP/VP or Joe Bain.
- International Student Services and Global Affairs will be merging effective July 24 and will report to Academic Affairs.
- The University is formulating a plan to get the Quad and university property in better shape. Administration is working on a short-term plan and long-term improvements.
- Dr. Mason has asked Emily Washburn from HHP to chair a committee to take the Well Tiges initiative campus wide. A committee has been formed.

#### **Enrollment Update**

- Summer enrollment is up 100 in headcount and down 420 in SEH.
  - o Domestic enrollment for the summer term is up.

- For the fall semester, headcount is up 174 students on campus, 130 students online, and up over 3,000 credit hours. Freshman numbers are up 50 students and China enrollment is projected to be up.
- The freshman retention rate last year was 76 percent.
