Academic Affairs Update

- FHSU will be receiving a list of programs from the Board of Regents that do not meet two of the four criteria KBOR laid out. A timeline has been created as reported in the Cabinet notes. Jill will be working with the programs that make the list. FHSU will make recommendations to the Board of Regents by April 2024.
- IR office submits multiple reports to the Kansas Board of Regents throughout the year. Reports are uploaded on the Board of Regents website -<u>https://kansasregents.org/data/system_data</u>
- Melissa Hunsicker-Walburn will serve a second year as the Interim Dean of the College of Business and Entrepreneurship. A national search will be conducted during the 2024-25 academic year.

VPSA Update

- Board of Regents
 - Room and Board rates for 2024-25 will be taken to the November KBOR meeting for first reading.
 - Reverse transfer meeting was rescheduled. Apply Kansas dates are November 7, 8, and 9. FHSU honors the month of October, as long as high school counselors send the Registrar's office a waiver form.
 - MIAA VP meeting will be held in Joplin, MO on November 9 on the Missouri Southern University campus. SGA would like to have an SGA MIAA meeting in the spring at the MIAA tournament in Kansas City.
- Kathleen will be the co-lead for the Navigate project, along with Angela Pool-Funai from Academic Affairs.
- FHSU has requested a legislative ask to fund an addition to Stroup Hall which will allow the Nursing Department to increase the number of students they can admit to their program.
 - FHSU is working with Colby Community College to develop a partnership with their nursing program.

Food Service RFP

- The RFP for food service is being reviewed by legal counsel and purchasing.
- RFP will be sent out the end of October. Bid will be out for 30 days. Bidders will be invited to the FHSU campus for a tour of our facilities.
- Bidders will then submit their bid. Dave estimates we will receive five to six bids. FHSU will review the bids and invite two to three vendors to campus separately for a one-day presentation.
- The decision for the vendor will be made by late January with a contract start date of July 1, 2024. The new vendor contract will be for five years.

Enrollment Leadership Update

- Fall 2023
 - Small increase in Hispanic population.
 - African American students also showed a small increase.
 - Pres release went out this past week.
 - Fall 2023 is down 108 students from Fall 2022
