VP Update

- HR Update
 - Shannon Lindsey has retired as the HR Director. Carrie Lane will serve as the Interim Director while they search for the HR Director.

- KBOR Meeting
 - o Free application dates for next academic year were approved by the KBOR.
 - Fees for 2024-25 were discussed. Most schools are looking at a tuition and fee. The first reading will be heard at the May meeting.
 - o State of the Regent enrollment report was presented.
- The FHSU China delegation will be traveling to China May 21 to June 3 for commencement ceremonies. Joey will not be traveling to China.
- MIAA VP Meeting
 - The meeting was held Friday, March 8 in Kansas City and 9 VP's attended.
 For the first time, SGA leadership from the MIAA schools also met with over 30 students attending.

Academic Affairs

- FHSU Faculty-Student Mentoring Program Proposal (attached)
 - The professional advisor program was implemented on the FHSU campus three years ago for all undergraduate students.
 - For the Fall 2024 semester, Academic Affairs will be deploying the next part of the program, which is the faculty mentor piece.
 - Jill met with all department chairs, deans, assistant deans this past week. Taylor, Hannah and Kayla were also present at the meeting to discussed how the faculty mentor program will be shared to students during orientation.
 - A faculty team, Angela Walters, Justin Greenleaf, and Jessica Heronemus, created the faculty mentor program. Faculty mentors are different than a student's faculty advisor.
 - Every undergraduate student at FHSU will have an academic advisor and faculty mentor in their home program. Online and on-campus mentor program will look a little different. This next year will be a learning period for departments to figure out what works best for their department.
 - Department chairs will determine who the faculty mentors will be for their departments.
 - Jill will also be meeting with the professional advisors about the program.
 - HLC Change of Control
 - On March 18 and 19, peer reviewers were on campus evaluating the change of control with NCK Tech and Northwest Kansas Technical College. The reviewers were looking at the vision, expectations, and metrics that will be used to measure if we are successful.
 - Very positive visit. HLC will provide a written report by June.
 - A new VP for Academic Affairs at KBOR started this past week.

Enrollment Update

- Enrollment
 - Fall 2024 applications are up. We are also up in housing contracts for 2024-25.
 - Spring 2024 enrollment was down 1.4 percent compared to being down 1.7 percent for the Fall 2023 semester.
- Wrike
 - Financial Aid is the priority for the next 4 to 6 weeks.
- RNL Marketing
 - Brad from RNL has been on campus this past week looking at the marketing set up.
 - RNL will provide their report to FHSU.

- Taylor shared information about the work in the Student Success cluster. This year, the Student Success team has prioritized helping us and others better understand our area. During the fall, it became evident we needed to expand this across campus, which has increased our teamwork and impact on student learning and support.
