History of the M/NUFP Program

- MUFP initiated in 1989-90
 - Identify ways for members of underrepresented populations to become aware of & involved in the field as a profession
- 2000-01 inclusion of students with disabilities to broaden the scope of MUFP's mission
- July 2005 realignment of MUFP to include LGBT students, new program considerations, and addressing changing constituencies → NUFP



NUFP Mission

To increase the number of historically disenfranchised and underrepresented professionals in student affairs and/or higher education, including but not limited to those of racial and ethnic-minority background; those having a disability; and those identifying as LGBTQ.

Successes


- Exploration & project-based learning
